AN ACT

To amend the Implementing Recommendations of the 9/11 Commission Act of 2007 to authorize the Secretary of Homeland Security to accept and use gifts for otherwise authorized activities of the Center for Domestic Preparedness that are related to preparedness for and response to terrorism, and for other purposes.

11	U.S.C. 453(b)), the Secretary may accept and use
12	gifts of property, both real and personal, and may
13	accept gifts of services, including from guest lec-
14	turers, for otherwise authorized activities of the Cen-
15	ter for Domestic Preparedness that are related to
16	preparedness for and response to terrorism.
17	"(2) Report.—The Secretary shall report an-
18	nually to the Committee on Homeland Security of
19	the House of Representatives and the Committee on
20	Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the

15	"(a) Authority.—The Secretary may accept and use						
16	gifts of property, both real and personal, and may accept						
17	$gifts\ of\ services,\ including\ from\ guest\ lecturers,\ for\ otherwise$						
18	authorized activities of the Center for Domestic Prepared-						
19	ness that are related to efforts to prevent, prepare for, pro-						
20	tect against, or respond to a natural disaster, act of ter-						
21	rorism, or other man-made disaster, including the use of						
22	a weapon of mass destruction.						
23	"(b) Prohibition.—The Secretary may not accept a						
24	gift under this section if the Secretary determines that the

2	rity or appearance of integrity of—				
3	"(1) a program of the Department; or				
4	"(2) an individual involved in a program of the				
5	Department.				
6	"(c) Report.—				
7	"(1) In general.—The Secretary shall submit				
8	to the Committee on Homeland Security of the House				
9	of Representatives and the Committee on Homeland				
10	Security and Governmental Affairs of the Senate a				
11	annual report disclosing—				
12	"(A) any gifts that were accepted under this				
13	section during the year covered by the report;				
14	"(B) how the gifts contribute to the mission				
15	of the Center for Domestic Preparedness; and				
16	"(C) the amount of Federal savings that				
17	were generated from the acceptance of the gifts.				
18	"(2) Publication.—Each report required under				
19	paragraph (1) shall be made publically available.";				
20	(2) in section 873(b) (6 U.S.C. 453(b)), by strik-				
21	ing "and by section 93" and all that follows through				
22	"or donations" and inserting "by section 93 of title				
23	14, United States Code, or by section 525 or 884 of				
24	this Act, gifts or donations"; and				

1	(3) in section 884 (6 U.S.C. 464), by adding at					
2	2 the end the following:					
3	"(c) Acceptance and Use of Gifts.—The Fede					
4	Law Enforcement Training Center may accept and us					
5	gifts of property, both real and personal, and accept serv					
6	ices, for authorized purposes.".					
7	(b) Technical and Conforming Amendments.—					
8	3 (1) The homeland security act of 2002.—					
9	9 The Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 101					
10	seq.) is amended in the table of contents by inserting					
11	after the item relating to section 524 the following:					
	"Sec. 525. Acceptance of gifts.".					
12	(2) Repeal.—The matter under the heading					
13	"SALARIES AND EXPENSES" under the heading "Fed-					
14	ERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING CENTER" under					
15	title IV of the Department of Homeland Security Ap-					
16	6 propriations Act, 2004 (6 U.S.C. 464a) is amend					
17	by striking "Provided, That in fiscal year 2004 and					
18	thereafter, the Center is authorized to accept and use					
19	gifts of property, both real and personal, and to ac-					
20	cept services, for authorized purposes: Provided fur-					

ther," and inserting "Provided,".
