A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study to determine the suitability and feasibility of adding the Heart Mountain Relocation Center, in the State of Wyoming, as a unit of the National Park System.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Heart Mountain Relo-
5 cation Center Study Act of 2009”.

6 **SEC. 2. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.**

7 (a) STUDY.—The Secretary of the Interior shall con-
8 duct a special resource study of the Heart Mountain Relo-
9 cation Center, in Park County, Wyoming.

10 (b) CONTENTS.—In conducting the study under sub-
11 section (a), the Secretary shall—

12 (1) evaluate the national significance of the
13 Heart Mountain Relocation Center and surrounding
14 area;

15 (2) determine the suitability and feasibility of
16 designating the Heart Mountain Relocation Center
17 as a unit of the National Park System;

18 (3) consider other alternatives for preservation,
19 protection, and interpretation of the site by Federal,
20 State, or local governmental entities, or private and
21 nonprofit organizations;

22 (4) identify cost estimates for any Federal ac-
23 quisition, development, interpretation, operation, and
24 maintenance associated with the alternatives;

1 (5) identify any potential impacts of designation
2 of the site as a unit of the National Park System
3 on private landowners; and

4 (6) consult with interested Federal, State, or
5 local governmental entities, federally recognized In-
6 dian tribes, private and nonprofit organizations,
7 owners of private property that may be affected by
8 any such designation, or any other interested indi-
9 viduals.

10 (c) APPLICABLE LAW.—The study required under
11 subsection (a) shall be conducted in accordance with sec-
12 tion 8 of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

13 (d) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
14 on which funds are first made available for the study
15 under subsection (a), the Secretary shall submit to the
16 Committee on Natural Resources of the House of Rep-
17 resentatives and the Committee on Energy and Natural
18 Resources of the Senate a report containing the results
19 of the study and any conclusions and recommendations of
20 the Secretary.

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
