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## A BILL

To provide Capitol-flown flags to the immediate family of fire fighters, law enforcement officers, emergency medical technicians, and other rescue workers who are killed in the line of duty.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Fallen Heroes Flag  
3 Act of 2009”.

4 **SEC. 2. PROVIDING CAPITOL-FLOWN FLAGS FOR FAMILIES**  
5 **OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AND RESCUE WORK-**  
6 **ERS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—At the request of the immediate  
8 family of a fire fighter, law enforcement officer, emergency  
9 technician, or other rescue worker who died in the line  
10 of duty, the Representative of the family may provide the  
11 family with a Capitol-flown flag, together with the certifi-  
12 cate described in subsection (c).

13 (b) NO COST TO FAMILY.—A flag provided under  
14 this section shall be provided at no cost to the family.

15 (c) CERTIFICATE.—The certificate described in this  
16 subsection is a certificate which is signed by the Speaker  
17 of the House of Representatives and the Representative  
18 providing the flag, and which contains an expression of  
19 sympathy from the House of Representatives for the fam-  
20 ily involved, as prepared and developed by the Clerk of  
21 the House of Representatives.

22 (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

23 (1) the term “Capitol-flown flag” means a  
24 United States flag flown over the United States  
25 Capitol in honor of the deceased individual for whom  
26 such flag is requested; and

1           (2) the term “Representative” includes a Dele-  
2           gate or Resident Commissioner to the Congress.

3 **SEC. 3. REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES.**

4           (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 30 days after the  
5           date of the date of the enactment of this Act, the Clerk  
6           shall issue regulations for carrying out this Act, including  
7           regulations to establish procedures (including any appro-  
8           priate forms, guidelines, and accompanying certificates)  
9           for requesting a Capitol-flown flag.

10          (b) APPROVAL BY COMMITTEE ON HOUSE ADMINIS-  
11          TRATION.—The regulations issued by the Clerk under sub-  
12          section (a) shall take effect upon approval by the Com-  
13          mittee on House Administration of the House of Rep-  
14          resentatives.

15 **SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

16          There are authorized to be appropriated from the ap-  
17          plicable accounts of the House of Representatives for fiscal  
18          year 2009 and each succeeding fiscal year such sums as  
19          may be necessary to carry out this Act.

20 **SEC. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

21          This Act shall take effect on the date of its enact-  
22          ment, except that no flags may be provided under section  
23          2 until the Committee on House Administration of the  
24          House of Representatives approves the regulations issued

1 by the Clerk of the House of Representatives under section  
2 3.



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
