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## A BILL

To use amounts repaid to the Treasury under the Troubled Assets Relief Program for relief to displaced and low-wage workers, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Federal Bailout for  
5 American Individuals and Families in Distress Today and  
6 Tomorrow Act of 2009”.

1 **SEC. 2. TRANSFER OF REPAID TARP FUNDS TO FEDERAL**  
2 **EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMS.**

3 (a) TRANSFER OF FUNDS.—Of funds that were made  
4 available under title I of the Emergency Economic Sta-  
5 bilization Act of 2008 (12 U.S.C. 5211 et seq.) that have  
6 been repaid to the Treasury by a financial institution, the  
7 Secretary of the Treasury shall—

8 (1) make available to the Secretary of Labor  
9 \$8,000,000,000 which shall be available for obliga-  
10 tion on the date of enactment of this Act, as follows:

11 (A) for activities under the Workforce In-  
12 vestment Act of 1998—

13 (i) \$2,000,000,000 for grants to the  
14 States for adult employment and training  
15 activities, including supportive services and  
16 needs-related payments described in sec-  
17 tion 134(e)(2) and (3) of such Act (29  
18 U.S.C. 2864(e)(2) and (3)); and

19 (ii) \$2,000,000,000 for Migrant and  
20 Seasonal Farmworker Programs under sec-  
21 tion 167 of such Act (29 U.S.C. 2912);  
22 and

23 (B) \$4,000,000,000 for benefits and serv-  
24 ices under the Trade Adjustment Assistance for  
25 Workers program authorized in chapter II of

1 title II of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C.  
2 2271 et seq.); and

3 (2) make available to the Secretary of Health  
4 and Human Services \$2,000,000,000 which shall be  
5 available for obligation on the date of enactment of  
6 this Act for deposit into the Emergency Contingency  
7 Fund for State Temporary Assistance for Needy  
8 Families Programs established under section 403(c)  
9 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 603(c)).

10 (b) AUTHORIZATION.—The transfers authorized  
11 under subsection (a) shall be deemed actions authorized  
12 under title I of the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act  
13 of 2008 (12 U.S.C. 5201 et seq.).

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
