- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. EXEMPTION FROM PRESUMPTION THAT AN
- 4 ALIEN IS AN IMMIGRANT.
- 5 Section 214(b) of the Immigration and Nationality
- 6 Act (8 U.S.C. 1184(b)) is amended—

1	(1) by striking "(b) Every alien (other than"
2	and inserting the following:
3	"(b)(1) Every alien (except for a nonimmigrant de-
4	scribed in paragraph (2),";
5	(2) by striking "and other than" and inserting
6	"and"; and
7	(3) by adding at the end the following:
8	"(2) An alien is described in this paragraph if the
9	alien—
10	"(A) is a family member of an individual who—
11	"(i) is suffering from a serious health con-
12	dition (as such term is defined in section
13	101(11) of the Family and Medical Leave Act
14	of 1993 (29 U.S.C. 2611(11)); and
15	"(ii) is a citizen of the United States or an
16	alien lawfully admitted to the United States for
17	permanent residence;
18	"(B) seeks to enter the United States to pro-
19	vide care to the individual described in subparagraph
20	(A); and
21	"(C) submits an attestation from a health care
22	provider (as such term is defined in section 101(6)
23	of the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993 (29
24	U.S.C. 2611(6)) of the individual described in sub-
25	paragraph (A) that includes—

1	"(i) a diagnosis statement, which includes
2	the treatment being provided; and
3	"(ii) the expected time period during which
4	such care will be required.".
