To amend title I of the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act of 2000 to provide for grants and technical assistance to improve services rendered to children and adults with autism, and their families, and to expand the number of University Centers for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities Education, Research, and Service.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Training and Research
5	for Autism Improvements Nationwide Act of 2010" or the
6	"TRAIN Act of 2010".
7	SEC. 2. UNIVERSITY CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE INITIATIVES
8	ON AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS.
9	(a) IN GENERAL.—Subtitle D of title I of the Develop-
10	mental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act of
11	2000 (42 U.S.C. 15061 et seq.) is amended—
12	(1) by inserting before section 151 the following:
13	"PART 1—GENERAL GRANT PROGRAMS FOR
14	UNIVERSITY CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE"
15	; and
16	(2) by adding at the end the following:
17	"PART 2—UNIVERSITY CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE
18	INITIATIVES ON AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS
19	"SEC. 157. AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS INITIATIVE
20	GRANTS AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.
21	"(a) GRANTS.—
22	"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall award
23	multiyear grants for the purpose described in para-
24	graph (2) to University Centers for Excellence in De-
25	velopmental Disabilities Education, Research, and

1	Service that are funded under part 1 and engaged in
2	the core functions described in section $153(a)(2)$.
3	"(2) PURPOSE.—The purpose described in this
4	paragraph is to provide individuals with inter-
5	disciplinary training, continuing education, technical
6	assistance, and information for the purpose of im-
7	proving services rendered to children and adults on
8	the autism spectrum, and their families, to address
9	unmet needs related to autism spectrum disorder. For
10	purposes of the previous sentence, individuals shall
11	include children and adults on the autism spectrum,
12	families of such children and adults, health profes-
13	sionals (including allied health professionals), and vo-
14	cational training and educational professionals.
15	"(3) Application requirements.—A Univer-
16	sity Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabil-
17	ities Education, Research, and Service that desires to
18	receive a grant under this section shall submit to the
19	Secretary an application—
20	"(A) demonstrating that the Center has ca-
21	pacity to—
22	"(i) provide training and technical as-
23	sistance in evidence-based practices to
24	evaluate, and provide effective interventions,
25	services, treatments, and supports to, chil-

1	dren and adults on the autism spectrum
2	and their families;
3	"(ii) provide individuals on the autism
4	spectrum, and the families of such individ-
5	uals, opportunities to advise and direct ac-
6	tivities under the grant to ensure that an
7	individual-centered, and family-centered,
8	approach is used;
9	"(iii) share and disseminate materials
10	and practices that are developed for, and
11	evaluated to be effective in, the provision of
12	training and technical assistance; and
13	"(iv) provide training, technical assist-
14	ance, interventions, services, treatments,
15	and supports under this section statewide;
16	(B) providing assurances that the Center
17	will—
18	"(i) provide trainees under this section
19	with an appropriate balance of inter-
20	disciplinary didactic and community-based
21	experiences; and
22	"(ii) provide to the Secretary, in the
23	manner prescribed by the Secretary, data
24	regarding the number of individuals who
25	have benefitted from, and outcomes of, the

1	provision of training and technical assist-
2	ance under this section;
3	``(C) providing assurances that training,
4	technical assistance, dissemination of informa-
5	tion, and services under this section will—
6	"(i) be consistent with the goals of this
7	Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act of
8	1990, the Individuals with Disabilities
9	Education Act, and the Elementary and
10	Secondary Education Act of 1965;
11	"(ii) supplement, and not supplant,
12	activities funded under this subtitle (other
13	than this section);
14	"(iii) be planned and designed with
15	the participation of individuals on the au-
16	tism spectrum and the families of such in-
17	dividuals; and
18	"(iv) be conducted in coordination
19	with relevant State agencies, institutions of
20	higher education, and service providers; and
21	(D) containing such other information and
22	assurances as the Secretary may require.
23	"(4) Amount of grants.—The amount of a
24	grant to a University Center for Excellence in Devel-
25	opmental Disabilities Education, Research, and Serv-

ice for a fiscal year under this section shall be not less
 than \$250,000.

3 "(b) TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.—The Secretary may re4 serve not more than 2 percent of the amount appropriated
5 to carry out this section for a fiscal year to make a grant
6 to a national organization with demonstrated capacity for
7 providing training and technical assistance to—

8 "(1) assist in national dissemination of specific 9 information, including evidence-based best practices, from interdisciplinary training programs, and when 10 11 appropriate, other entities whose findings would inform the work performed by University Centers for 12 13 Excellence in Developmental Disabilities Education. 14 Research, and Service awarded grants under this sec-15 tion;

"(2) compile and disseminate strategies and materials that prove to be effective in the provision of
training and technical assistance so that the entire
network can benefit from the models, materials, and
practices developed in individual centers;

23 "(4) develop a (or enhance an existing) Web por24 tal that will provide linkages to each of the individual
25 training initiatives and provide access to training

3	"(5) serve as a research-based resource for Fed-
4	eral and State policymakers on information con-
5	cerning the provision of training and technical assist-
6	ance for the assessment, and provision of supports
7	and services for, children and adults on the autism
8	spectrum;
9	"(6) convene experts from multiple interdiscipli-
10	nary training programs, individuals on the autism
11	spectrum, and the families of such individuals to dis-
12	cuss and make recommendations with regard to train-
13	ing issues related to assessment, interventions, serv-
14	ices, treatment, and supports for children and adults
15	on the autism spectrum; and
16	"(7) undertake any other functions that the Sec-
17	retary determines to be appropriate.
18	"(c) Authorization of Appropriations.—To carry
19	out this section, there are authorized to be appropriated
20	\$17,000,000 for each of the fiscal years 2012 through 2016.
21	"SEC. 158. CAPACITY BUILDING GRANTS.
22	"(a) GRANTS.—The Secretary shall award multiyear
23	grants to not more than 4 University Centers for Excellence
24	in Developmental Disabilities Education, Research, and
25	Service described in paragraph (1) of section 157(a) to-
