## A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to extend the time period in which an individual may transfer entitlement of Post-9/11 Educational Assistance benefits to dependents.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Post-9/11 Military  
5 Family Fair Education Opportunity Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. INCREASED TIME TO TRANSFER ENTITLEMENT OF**  
2 **POST-9/11 EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE BENE-**  
3 **FITS.**

4 (a) **TIME FOR TRANSFER.**—Paragraph (1) of section  
5 3319(f) of title 38, United States Code, is amended to  
6 read as follows:

7 “(1) **TIME FOR TRANSFER.**—Subject to the  
8 time limitation for use of entitlement under section  
9 3321 of this title, an individual may transfer entitle-  
10 ment to educational assistance under this section  
11 during the period beginning on the date on which  
12 the individual becomes eligible under subsection (b)  
13 and ending on the date that is 10 years after the  
14 date of such individual’s last discharge or release  
15 from active duty (as described in section  
16 3321(b)(3)).”.

17 (b) **CONFORMING AMENDMENT.**—Subsection (b) of  
18 such section is amended in the matter preceding para-  
19 graph (1) by striking “, at the time of the approval of  
20 the individual’s request to transfer entitlement to edu-  
21 cational assistance under this section,”.

22 (c) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendments made by  
23 this Act shall take effect as if included in the enactment  
24 of the Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act of  
25 2008 (title V of Public Law 110–252).
