## A BILL

For the relief of Jayantibhai Desai and Indiraben Patel.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 2 3 SECTION PERMANENT RESIDENT **STATUS** 1. FOR 4 JAYANTIBHAI DESAI AND INDIRABEN PATEL. 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding subsections (a) 6 and (b) of section 201 of the Immigration and Nationality 7 Act, Jayantibhai Desai and Indiraben Patel shall each be 8 eligible for issuance of an immigrant visa or for adjust-9 ment of status to that of an alien lawfully admitted for 10 permanent residence upon filing an application for 11 issuance of an immigrant visa under section 204 of such

Act or for adjustment of status to lawful permanent resi dent.

3 (b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If Jayantibhai Desai 4 or Indiraben Patel enters the United States before the fil-5 ing deadline specified in subsection (c), he or she shall 6 be considered to have entered and remained lawfully and 7 shall, if otherwise eligible, be eligible for adjustment of 8 status under section 245 of the Immigration and Nation-9 ality Act as of the date of the enactment of this Act.

10 (c) DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF FEES.—Subsections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the ap-11 12 plication for issuance of an immigrant visa or the applica-13 tion for adjustment of status is filed with appropriate fees within 2 years after the date of the enactment of this Act. 14 15 (d) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBER.— Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent res-16 17 idence to Jayantibhai Desai and Indiraben Patel, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper officer to reduce 18

19 by 2, during the current or next following fiscal year, the
20 total number of immigrant visas that are made available
21 to natives of each of the countries of the alien's birth
22 under section 203(a) of the Immigration and Nationality
23 Act or, if applicable, the total number of immigrant visas
24 that are made available to natives of each of the countries
25 of the alien's birth under section 202(e) of such Act.

1 (e) Denial  $\mathbf{OF}$ Preferential IMMIGRATION TREATMENT FOR CERTAIN RELATIVES.—The natural 2 parents, brothers, and sisters of Jayantibhai Desai and 3 Indiraben Patel shall not, by virtue of such relationship, 4 be accorded any right, privilege, or status under the Immi-5 gration and Nationality Act. 6
