## RESOLUTION

- Recognizing and honoring the Americans troops who gave their lives on D-Day at the Battle of Normandy.
- Whereas June 6 marks the 65th anniversary of the D-Day landings at Normandy, France;
- Whereas more than 150,000 troops of the Allied forces participated in the Normandy landings;
- Whereas 31,000 Americans stormed the beaches of Normandy on D-Day and more than 6,000 of them gave their lives fighting for the cause of freedom;
- Whereas the average age of American troops fighting in the Battle of Normandy was 20 years old; and

Whereas the Allied landings on D-Day led to the liberation of France and culminated in the ultimate annihilation of the Nazi empire: Now, therefore, be it

- 1 Resolved, That the House of Representatives—
- 2 (1) honors the Americans troops who gave their
- 3 lives in the Battle of Normandy;
- 4 (2) recognizes the 65th anniversary of the D-
- 5 Day landings at Normandy, France; and
- 6 (3) expresses gratitude to the "greatest genera-
- 7 tion" of Americans who fearlessly fought for free-
- 8 dom.
