- 1 Resolved, That the House of Representatives requests
- 2 the President, and directs the Secretary of Defense, to
- 3 transmit to the House of Representatives, not later than
- 4 14 days after the date of the adoption of this resolution,
- 5 copies of any portions of all documents, records, and com-
- 6 munications in the possession of the Secretary of Defense,
- 7 or any officer or employee of the Department of Defense,

1	that were created on or after January 1, 2005, and that
2	refer or relate to how notifying foreign persons captured
3	in Afghanistan who are suspected of terrorism and detain-
4	ees in the custody of the Department of Defense in Af-
5	ghanistan of rights under Miranda v. Arizona, 384 U.S
6	436 (1966) may affect—
7	(1) the rules of engagement of the Armed
8	Forces deployed in support of Operation Enduring
9	Freedom;
10	(2) post-capture interrogations and intelligence-
11	gathering activities conducted as part of Operation
12	Enduring Freedom;
13	(3) the overall counterinsurgency strategy and
14	objectives of the United States for Operation Endur-
15	ing Freedom;
16	(4) United States military operations and objec-
17	tives in Afghanistan; and
18	(5) potential risks to members of the Armed
