Ms. MATSUI submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3619) to authorize appropriations for the Coast Guard for fiscal year 2010, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3619) to authorize appropriations  
6 for the Coast Guard for fiscal year 2010, and for other  
7 purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed

1 with. All points of order against consideration of the bill  
2 are waived except those arising under clause 9 or 10 of  
3 rule XXI. General debate shall be confined to the bill and  
4 shall not exceed one hour, with 40 minutes equally divided  
5 and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member  
6 of the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure  
7 and 20 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair  
8 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Home-  
9 land Security. After general debate the bill shall be consid-  
10 ered for amendment under the five-minute rule. The  
11 amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by  
12 the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure now  
13 printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted in the  
14 House and in the Committee of the Whole. The bill, as  
15 amended, shall be considered as the original bill for the  
16 purpose of further amendment under the five-minute rule  
17 and shall be considered as read. All points of order against  
18 provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. Notwith-  
19 standing clause 11 of rule XVIII, no further amendment  
20 to the bill, as amended, shall be in order except those  
21 printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accom-  
22 panying this resolution. Each such amendment may be of-  
23 fered only in the order printed in the report, may be of-  
24 fered only by a Member designated in the report, shall  
25 be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time spec-

1 ified in the report equally divided and controlled by the  
2 proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amend-  
3 ment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division  
4 of the question. All points of order against such amend-  
5 ments are waived except those arising under clause 9 or  
6 10 of rule XXI. At the conclusion of consideration of the  
7 bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and report  
8 the bill, as amended, to the House with such further  
9 amendments as may have been adopted. In the case of  
10 sundry amendments reported from the Committee, the  
11 question of their adoption shall be put to the House en  
12 gros and without division of the question. The previous  
13 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and  
14 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening  
15 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-  
16 structions.

17       SEC. 2. The Chair may entertain a motion that the  
18 Committee rise only if offered by the chair of the Com-  
19 mittee on Transportation and Infrastructure or his des-  
20 ignee. The Chair may not entertain a motion to strike out  
21 the enacting words of the bill (as described in clause 9  
22 of rule XVIII).
