## A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on certain fiberglass sheets used to make ceiling tiles.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN FIBERGLASS SHEETS USED TO MAKE**

4 **CEILING TILES.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of  
6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is  
7 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following  
8 new heading:

“	9902.01.00	Thin smooth nonwoven fiber-glass sheets, approximately 0.4 mm to 0.8 mm thick, comprised principally of a blend of 8 micron and 10 micron glass fibers bound in an acrylic latex binder cross-linked with a melamine-formaldehyde resin of a kind primarily used as acoustical facing for ceiling panels (provided for in subheading 7019.32.00) .....	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2011	”.

1           (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by  
2 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from  
3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after  
4 the date of the enactment of this Act.
