Ms. STABENOW (for herself, Mr. MERKLEY, Mr. FRANKEN, Mr. BROWN of Ohio, and Mr. WHITEHOUSE) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To provide for an extension of unemployment insurance.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Unemployment Insur-
5 ance Extension Act of 2010”.

6 **SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE PRO-**
7 **VISIONS.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—(1) Section 4007 of the Supple-
9 mental Appropriations Act, 2008 (Public Law 110–252;
10 26 U.S.C. 3304 note) is amended—

1 (A) by striking “June 2, 2010” each place it
2 appears and inserting “December 31, 2010”;

3 (B) in the heading for subsection (b)(2), by
4 striking “JUNE 2, 2010” and inserting “DECEMBER
5 31, 2010”; and

6 (C) in subsection (b)(3), by striking “November
7 6, 2010” and inserting “May 31, 2011”.

8 (2) Section 2002(e) of the Assistance for Unemployed
9 Workers and Struggling Families Act, as contained in
10 Public Law 111–5 (26 U.S.C. 3304 note; 123 Stat. 438),
11 is amended—

12 (A) in paragraph (1)(B), by striking “June 2,
13 2010” and inserting “December 31, 2010”;

14 (B) in the heading for paragraph (2), by strik-
15 ing “JUNE 2, 2010” and inserting “DECEMBER 31,
16 2010”; and

17 (C) in paragraph (3), by striking “December 7,
18 2010” and inserting “June 30, 2011”.

19 (3) Section 2005 of the Assistance for Unemployed
20 Workers and Struggling Families Act, as contained in
21 Public Law 111–5 (26 U.S.C. 3304 note; 123 Stat. 444),
22 is amended—

23 (A) by striking “June 2, 2010” each place it
24 appears and inserting “January 1, 2011”; and

1 (B) in subsection (c), by striking “November 6,
2 2010” and inserting “June 1, 2011”.

3 (4) Section 5 of the Unemployment Compensation
4 Extension Act of 2008 (Public Law 110–449; 26 U.S.C.
5 3304 note) is amended by striking “November 6, 2010”
6 and inserting “May 31, 2011”.

7 (b) FUNDING.—Section 4004(e)(1) of the Supple-
8 mental Appropriations Act, 2008 (Public Law 110–252;
9 26 U.S.C. 3304 note) is amended—

10 (1) in subparagraph (D), by striking “and” at
11 the end; and

12 (2) by inserting after subparagraph (E) the fol-
13 lowing:

14 “(F) the amendments made by section
15 2(a)(1) of the Unemployment Insurance Exten-
16 sion Act of 2010; and”.

17 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
18 this section shall take effect as if included in the enact-
19 ment of the Continuing Extension Act of 2010 (Public
20 Law 111–157).

21 **SEC. 3. BUDGETARY PROVISIONS.**

22 (a) STATUTORY PAYGO.—The budgetary effects of
23 this Act, for the purpose of complying with the Statutory
24 Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010, shall be determined by ref-
25 erence to the latest statement titled “Budgetary Effects

1 of PAYGO Legislation” for this Act, submitted for print-
2 ing in the Congressional Record by the Chairman of the
3 Senate Budget Committee, provided that such statement
4 has been submitted prior to the vote on passage.

5 (b) EMERGENCY DESIGNATIONS.—Section 2—

6 (1) is designated as an emergency requirement
7 pursuant to section 4(g) of the Statutory Pay-As-
8 You-Go Act of 2010 (Public Law 111–139; 2 U.S.C.
9 933(g));

10 (2) in the House of Representatives, is des-
11 ignated as an emergency for purposes of pay-as-you-
12 go principles; and

13 (3) in the Senate, is designated as an emer-
14 gency requirement pursuant to section 403(a) of S.
15 Con. Res. 13 (111th Congress), the concurrent reso-
16 lution on the budget for fiscal year 2010.
