1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Preserving Foreign
3	Criminal Assets for Forfeiture Act of 2010".
4	SEC. 2. PRESERVATION OF PROPERTY SUBJECT TO FOR-
5	FEITURE UNDER FOREIGN LAW.
6	Section $2467(d)(3)(A)$ of title 28, United States
7	Code, is amended to read as follows:
8	"(A) RESTRAINING ORDERS.—
9	"(i) IN GENERAL.—To preserve the
10	availability of property subject to civil or
11	criminal forfeiture under foreign law, the
12	Government may apply for, and the court
13	may issue, a restraining order at any time
14	before or after the initiation of forfeiture
15	proceedings by a foreign nation.
16	"(ii) Procedures.—
17	"(I) IN GENERAL.—A restraining
18	order under this subparagraph shall
19	be issued in a manner consistent with
20	subparagraphs (A), (C), and (E) of
21	paragraph (1) and the procedural due
22	process protections for a restraining
23	order under section 983(j) of title 18.

"(aa) references in such sec-1 2 tion 983(j) to civil forfeiture or 3 the filing of a complaint shall be 4 deemed to refer to the applicable foreign criminal or forfeiture pro-5 6 ceedings; and "(bb) the reference in para-7 graph (1)(B)(i) of such section 8 9 983(j) to the United States shall 10 be deemed to refer to the foreign 11 nation.".
