A BILL

To provide that claims of the United States to certain documents relating to Franklin Delano Roosevelt shall be treated as waived and relinquished in certain circumstances.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. TREATMENT OF OWNERSHIP OF CERTAIN DOC-**
2 **UMENTS RELATING TO FRANKLIN DELANO**
3 **ROOSEVELT.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—If any person or entity makes a
5 gift of any property described in subsection (b) to the Na-
6 tional Archives and Records Administration, then any
7 claim of the United States to such property shall be treat-
8 ed as having been waived and relinquished on the day be-
9 fore the date of such gift.

10 (b) PROPERTY DESCRIBED.—Property is described in
11 this subsection if such property—

12 (1) is a part of the collection of documents, pa-
13 pers, and memorabilia relating to Franklin Delano
14 Roosevelt or any member of his family or staff; and

15 (2) was in the possession of Grace Tully and re-
16 tained by her at the time of her death.

17 (c) DATE OF GIFT.—The date of a gift referred to
18 in subsection (a) is any date specified by the donor so long
19 as such date is subsequent to the physical delivery of the
20 property described in subsection (b) to the National Ar-
21 chives and Records Administration.
