Authorizing expenditures by the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

FEBRUARY 5, 2009

Mr. DORGAN, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs.

1 *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, and making investiga-
5 tions as authorized by paragraphs 1 and 8 of rule XXVI
6 of the Standing Rules of the Senate, the Committee on
7 Indian Affairs is authorized from March 1, 2009, through
8 September 30, 2009; October 1, 2009, through September
9 30, 2010; and October 1, 2010, through February 28,
10 2011, in its discretion (1) to make expenditures from the

1 contingent fund of the Senate, (2) to employ personnel,
2 and (3) with the prior consent of the Government depart-
3 ment or agency concerned and the Committee on Rules
4 and Administration, to use on a reimbursable or non-reim-
5 bursable basis the services of personnel of any such de-
6 partment or agency.

7 SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
8 period March 1, 2009, through September 30, 2009,
9 under this resolution shall not exceed \$1,449,343.00, of
10 which amount (1) not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended
11 for the procurement of the services of individual consult-
12 ants, or organizations thereof (as authorized by section
13 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as
14 amended), and (2) not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended
15 for the training of professional staff of such committee
16 (under procedures specified by section 202(j) of the Legis-
17 lative Reorganization Act of 1946).

18 (b) For the period October 1, 2009, through Sep-
19 tember 30, 2010, expenses of the committee under this
20 resolution shall not exceed \$2,546,445.00, of which
21 amount (1) not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended for
22 the procurement of the services of individual consultants,
23 or organizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i)
24 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amend-
25 ed), and (2) not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended for

1 the training of professional staff of such committee (under
2 procedures specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative
3 Reorganization Act of 1946).

4 (c) For the period October 1, 2010, through Feb-
5 ruary 28, 2011, expenses of the committee under this res-
6 olution shall not exceed \$1,083,838.00, of which amount
7 (1) not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended for the pro-
8 curement of the services of individual consultants, or orga-
9 nizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the
10 Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended), and
11 (2) not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended for the train-
12 ing of professional staff of such committee (under proce-
13 dures specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorga-
14 nization Act of 1946).

15 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
16 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
17 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
18 date, but not later than February 28, 2011.

19 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
20 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
21 upon vouchers approved by the Chairman of the com-
22 mittee, except that vouchers shall not be required (1) for
23 the disbursement of the salaries of employees paid at an
24 annual rate, or (2) for the payment of telecommunications
25 provided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-

1 keeper, United States Senate, or (3) for the payment of
2 stationery supplies purchased through the Keeper of the
3 Stationery, United States Senate, or (4) for payments to
4 the Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5) for the pay-
5 ment of metered charges on copying equipment provided
6 by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper,
7 United States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate
8 Recording and Photographic Services, or (7) for payment
9 of franked and mass mail costs by the Sergeant at Arms
10 and Doorkeeper, United States Senate.

11 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
12 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
13 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,
14 2009, through September 30, 2009; October 1, 2009,
15 through September 30, 2010; and October 1, 2010,
16 through February 28, 2011, to be paid from the Appro-
17 priations account for “Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-
18 tigations”.

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
