Mr. Akaka, from the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

## RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Veterans' Affairs.

- 1 Resolved, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
- 2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
- 3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
- 4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
- 5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1
- 6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
- 7 the Committee on Veterans Affairs is authorized from
- 8 March 1, 2009, through September 30, 2009; October 1,
- 9 2009, through September 30, 2010 and October 1, 2010,
- 10 through February 28, 2011, in its discretion (1) to make

- 1 expenditures from the contingent fund of the Senate, (2)
- 2 to employ personnel, and (3) with the prior consent of the
- 3 Government department or agency concerned and the
- 4 Committee on Rules and Administration, to use on a reim-
- 5 bursable or non-reimbursable basis the services of per-
- 6 sonnel of any such department or agency.
- 7 Sec. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
- 8 period March 1, 2009, through September 30, 2009,
- 9 under this resolution shall not exceed \$1,565,089 of which
- 10 amount (1) not to exceed \$59,000 may be expended for
- 11 the procurement of the services of individual consultants,
- 12 or organizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i)
- 13 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amend-
- 14 ed), and (2) not to exceed \$12,000 may be expended for
- 15 the training of the professional staff of such committee
- 16 (under procedures specified by section 202(j) of the Legis-
- 17 lative Reorganization Act of 1946).
- 18 (b) For the period October 1, 2009, through Sep-
- 19 tember 30, 2010, expenses of the committee under this
- 20 resolution shall not exceed \$2,752,088 of which amount
- 21 (1) not to exceed \$100,000 may be expended for the pro-
- 22 curement of the services of individual consultants, or orga-
- 23 nizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(I) of the
- 24 Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended), and
- 25 (2) not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended for the train-

- 1 ing of the professional staff of such committee (under pro-
- 2 cedures specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reor-
- 3 ganization Act of 1946).
- 4 (c) For the period October 1, 2010, through Feb-
- 5 ruary 28, 2011, expenses of the committee under this res-
- 6 olution shall not exceed \$1,172,184, of which amount (1)
- 7 not to exceed \$42,000 may be expended for the procure-
- 8 ment of the services of individual consultants, or organiza-
- 9 tions thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legis-
- 10 lative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended), and (2)
- 11 not to exceed \$8,334 may be expended for the training
- 12 of the professional staff of such committee (under proce-
- 13 dures specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorga-
- 14 nization Act of 1946).
- 15 Sec. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
- 16 gether with such recommendation for legislation as it
- 17 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
- 18 date, but not later than February 28, 2009, and February
- 19 28, 2010, respectively.
- Sec. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
- 21 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
- 22 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the com-
- 23 mittee, except that vouchers shall not be required for (1)
- 24 the disbursement of salaries of employees paid at an an-
- 25 nual rate, or (2) for the payment of telecommunications

- 1 provided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
- 2 keeper, United States Senate, or (3) for the payment sta-
- 3 tionery supplies purchased through the Keeper of Sta-
- 4 tionery, United States Senate, or (4) for payments to the
- 5 Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5) for the payment
- 6 of metered charges on copying equipment provided by the
- 7 Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper, United
- 8 States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate Recording
- 9 and Photographic Services, or (7) for payment of franked
- 10 and mass mail costs by the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
- 11 keeper, United States Senate.
- 12 Sec. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
- 13 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
- 14 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,
- 15 2009, through September 30, 2009; October 1, 2009,
- 16 through September 30, 2010; and October 1, 2010,
- 17 through February 28, 2011, to be paid from the appro-
- 18 priations account for "Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-
- 19 tigations".

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
