## RESOLUTION

To increase transparency by requiring Senate amendments to be made available to the public in a timely manner.

1 Resolved,

### 2 SECTION 1. AVAILABILITY TO THE PUBLIC.

Not later than 6 months after the date of adoption of this resolution, the Secretary of the Senate shall make the Senate amendment database (ats.senate.gov or a similar amendment database) available to the public on a public website in a manner that will allow the public to view amendments as soon as they are made widely available to Members of Congress and staff. 2

### 1 SEC. 2. UPGRADES TO THE WEBSITE.

Not later than 6 months after the date of adoption
of this resolution, the Secretary of the Senate shall improve the Senate amendment website and any other
amendment website made available to the public by ensuring that—

7 (1) all amendments are scanned and posted on8 the website in their entirety;

9 (2) all submitted amendments have their pur10 pose inputted when they are entered into the
11 website;

(3) all amendments are identified on the
website as first degree or second degree and by what
bill or amendment they are offered, if available;

(4) all amendments on the website have the
dates they were submitted, proposed, and disposed
of; and

18 (5) all amendments and any associated
19 metadata are permanently available on the website
20 or the Legislative Information System (LIS)/
21 THOMAS sites.

22 SEC. 3. FUNDING.

It is the sense of the Senate that appropriationsshould be made available through the appropriations proc-ess to carry out this resolution.
