## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. POCKET VERSION OF THE UNITED STATES**  
4                    **CONSTITUTION.**

5        (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The 25th edition of the pocket  
6 version of the United States Constitution shall be printed

1 as a House document under the direction of the Joint  
2 Committee on Printing.

3 (b) ADDITIONAL COPIES.—In addition to the usual  
4 number, there shall be printed the lesser of—

5 (1) 235,500 copies of the document, of which  
6 220,500 copies shall be for the use of the House of  
7 Representatives, 10,000 copies shall be for the use  
8 of the Senate, and 5,000 copies shall be for the use  
9 of the Joint Committee on Printing; or

10 (2) such number of copies of the document as  
11 does not exceed a total production and printing cost  
12 of \$114,849, with distribution to be allocated in the  
13 same proportion as described in paragraph (1), ex-  
14 cept that in no case shall the number of copies be  
15 less than 1 per Member of Congress.

16 (c) DISTRIBUTION.—The copies of the document  
17 printed for the use of the House and the Senate under  
18 subsection (a) shall be distributed in accordance with—

19 (1) a distribution plan approved by the chair  
20 and ranking minority member of the Committee on  
21 House Administration of the House of Representa-  
22 tives, in the case of the copies printed for the use  
23 of the House; and

24 (2) a distribution plan approved by the chair  
25 and ranking minority member of the Committee on

1 Rules and Administration of the Senate, in the case  
2 of the copies printed for the use of the Senate.
