A BILL

To extend Corridor N of the Appalachian development highway system from its current northern terminus at Corridor M, near Ebensburg, Pennsylvania, to Corridor T, near Salamanca, New York, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Corridor N Extension
5 Act of 2011”.

6 **SEC. 2. APPALACHIAN DEVELOPMENT HIGHWAY SYSTEM.**

7 Section 14501(a) of title 40, United States Code, is
8 amended in the second sentence by striking “shall not”

1 and all that follows through the period at the end of that
2 sentence and inserting the following: “shall not be more
3 than 3,239 miles.”.

4 **SEC. 3. DESIGNATION OF ADDITION.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—There is designated as an addi-
6 tion to Corridor N of the Appalachian development high-
7 way system, located in Maryland and Pennsylvania, a seg-
8 ment from Corridor M to Corridor T.

9 (b) EXTENSION AND DEVELOPMENT.—The addition
10 to Corridor N described in subsection (a) shall—

- 11 (1) extend approximately 149 miles; and
12 (2) be developed as a multilane freeway, with
13 interchanges at appropriate crossroad locations.
