Mr. SARBANES introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

A BILL

To amend the Federal Water Pollution Control Act to create a designation for property owners who take actions to reduce nutrient and sediment runoff into the Chesapeake Bay watershed, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Save the Chesapeake
5 Bay Homeowner Act of 2011”.

1 **SEC. 2. DESIGNATION.**

2 Section 117(g) of the Federal Water Pollution Con-
3 trol Act (33 U.S.C. 1267(g)) is amended by adding at the
4 end the following:

5 “(3) DESIGNATION PROGRAM.—

6 “(A) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year
7 after the date of enactment of the Save the
8 Chesapeake Bay Homeowner Act of 2011, the
9 Administrator shall develop and implement the
10 ‘Save the Chesapeake Bay Home’ designation
11 program.

12 “(B) DESIGNATION REQUIREMENT.—The
13 program under subparagraph (A) shall des-
14 ignate a property owner in the Chesapeake Bay
15 watershed as a participant in such program if
16 the property owner performs a specified number
17 of items from a list of actions developed by the
18 Administrator to reduce nutrient and sediment
19 runoff into the Chesapeake Bay.

20 “(C) TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOAD CRED-
21 IT.—The Administrator shall determine an ap-
22 propriate amount of credit for compliance with
23 total maximum daily load requirements to
24 award to a State or their designee based on the
25 number of property owners in the jurisdiction

1 who have received a designation under the pro-
2 gram.”.

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
