3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans 2nd Amend-

1SEC. 2. CONDITIONS FOR TREATMENT OF CERTAIN PER-2SONS AS ADJUDICATED MENTALLY INCOM-3PETENT FOR CERTAIN PURPOSES.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 55 of title 38, United
5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol6 lowing new section:

7 "§ 5511. Conditions for treatment of certain persons 8 as adjudicated mentally incompetent for 9 certain purposes

10 "In any case arising out of the administration by the 11 Secretary of laws and benefits under this title, a person who is mentally incapacitated, deemed mentally incom-12 petent, or experiencing an extended loss of consciousness 13 14 shall not be considered adjudicated as a mental defective under subsection (d)(4) or (g)(4) of section 922 of title 15 18 without the order or finding of a judge, magistrate, 16 17 or other judicial authority of competent jurisdiction that such person is a danger to himself or herself or others.". 18 19 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections 20 at the beginning of chapter 55 of such title is amended 21 by adding at the end the following new item:

"5511. Conditions for treatment of certain persons as adjudicated mentally incompetent for certain purposes.".
