3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Byrne/JAG Program

6 Section 501 of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe
7 Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3751) is amended by add8 ing at the end the following new subsection:

9 "(h) RACIAL DISPARITIES PRACTICES.—For years beginning after the date of the enactment of the Byrne/ 10 11 JAG Program Accountability Act, States and units of local government receiving funds under this subpart shall 12 13 implement policy, practice, and system improvement strategies at the State, local, and tribal levels, as applicable, 14 to identify and reduce racial and ethnic disparities among 15 16 individuals who come into contact with or are under the supervision of the criminal justice system, without estab-17 lishing or requiring numerical standards or quotas, 18 19 through each of the following methods:

"(1) Establishing coordinating bodies, composed of criminal justice stakeholders at the State,
local, or tribal levels, as applicable, to oversee and
monitor efforts by such States, unit of local government, or Indian tribe to reduce racial and ethnic disparities.

1 "(2) Identifying and analyzing key decision 2 points in the criminal justice system of the State, 3 unit of local government, or Indian tribe, as applica-4 ble, to determine which points create racial and eth-5 nic disparities among those who come into contact 6 with the justice system. "(3) Developing and implementing data collec-7 8 tion and analysis systems to identify where racial 9 and ethnic disparities exist in the criminal justice 10 system and to track and analyze such disparities. 11 "(4) Developing and implementing a work plan 12 that includes measurable objectives for policy prac-13 tice or other system changes, based on the needs 14 identified in the data collection and analysis under 15 paragraphs (2) and (3). "(5) Publicly reporting, on an annual basis, the 16 17 efforts made in accordance with paragraphs (2), (3),

18 and (4) during the previous year.".

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
