### A BILL

To authorize the presentation of a United States flag at the funeral of Federal civilian employees who are killed while performing official duties or because of their status as a Federal employee.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Civilian Service Rec-
5	ognition Act of 2011".
6	SEC. 2. PRESENTATION OF UNITED STATES FLAG ON BE-
7	HALF OF FEDERAL CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES

11	(a) Presentation Required.—Upon receipt of a
12	request under subsection (b), the head of an executive
13	agency shall furnish a flag of the United States to drape
14	the easket of an individual who—
15	(1) was an employee of the agency; and
16	(2) was killed while performing official duties or
17	because of the individual's status as a Federal em-
18	<del>ployee.</del>
19	(b) REQUEST FOR FLAG.—The head of an executive
20	agency shall furnish a flag for a deceased employee de-
21	seribed in subsection (a) upon the request of—
22	(1) the employee's next of kin; or
23	(2) if no request is received from the next of
24	kin, a close friend or associate of the employee as
25	determined by the head of the executive agency.

- 1 (e) Manner of Presentation and Ceremony.—
- 2 A flag shall be furnished and presented under this section
- 3 in the same manner as a flag is furnished and presented
- 4 on behalf of a deceased member of the Armed Services
- 5 who dies while on active duty. At the request of the indi-
- 6 vidual who requested the flag under subsection (b), the
- 7 head of the executive agency furnishing the flag under
- 8 subsection (a) shall provide for the presentation of the flag
- 9 to the individual following the use of the flag to drape
- 10 the easket of the deceased employee.
- 11 (d) Limitation on Flags Provided.—If a flag fur-
- 12 nished under subsection (a) is presented to an individual
- 13 described in subsection (b)(2), no flag shall be subse-
- 14 quently presented to any other individual under this sec-
- 15 tion on account of the death of the same employee.
- 16 (e) Classified Information.—The head of an ex-
- 17 ecutive agency may disclose information necessary to show
- 18 that a deceased individual is an employee described in sub-
- 19 section (a) to the extent that such information is not clas-
- 20 sified and to the extent that such disclosure does not en-
- 21 danger the national security of the United States.
- 22 (f) Employee Notification of Flag Ceremony
- 23 Benefit.—The head of an executive agency shall provide
- 24 appropriate notice to employees of the agency of the flag
- 25 ceremony benefit provided for under this section.
