AN ACT

Making appropriations for the Legislative Branch for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2012, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

- 1 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
- 2 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the
- 3 Legislative Branch for the fiscal year ending September
- 4 30, 2012, and for other purposes, namely:
- 5 TITLE I—LEGISLATIVE BRANCH
- 6 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
- 7 Salaries and Expenses
- 8 For salaries and expenses of the House of Represent-
- 9 atives, \$1,226,680,000 (reduced by \$1,000,000), as fol-
- 10 lows:
- 11 HOUSE LEADERSHIP OFFICES
- 12 For salaries and expenses, as authorized by law,
- 13 \$23,275,773, including: Office of the Speaker,
- 14 \$6,942,770, including \$25,000 for official expenses of the
- 15 Speaker; Office of the Majority Floor Leader, \$2,277,595,
- 16 including \$10,000 for official expenses of the Majority
- 17 Leader; Office of the Minority Floor Leader, \$7,432,812,
- 18 including \$10,000 for official expenses of the Minority

- 19 the headings "Salaries" and "General Expenses" upon the
- 20 approval of the Committees on Appropriations of the
- 21 House of Representatives and the Senate.

- 1 Waiver by Chief of Capitol Police of Claims
- 2 Arising Out of Erroneous Payments to Offi-
- 3 CERS AND EMPLOYEES
- 4 Sec. 1002. (a) Waiver of Claim.—Subject to the
- 5 approval of the Capitol Police Board, the Chief of the
- 6 United States Capitol Police may waive in whole or in part
- 7 a claim of the United States against a person arising out
- 8 of an erroneous payment of any pay or allowances, other
- 9 than travel and transportation expenses and allowances,
- 10 to an officer, member, or employee of the United States
- 11 Capitol Police, if the collection of the claim would be
- 12 against equity and good conscience and not in the best
- 13 interests of the United States.
- 14 (b) Investigation of Application; Report.—The
- 15 Chief shall investigate each application for the waiver of
- 16 a claim under subsection (a) and shall submit a written
- 17 report of the investigation to the Capitol Police Board, ex-
- 18 cept that if the aggregate amount of the claim involved
- 19 exceeds \$1,500, the Comptroller General may also inves-
- 20 tigate the application and submit a written report of the
- 21 investigation to the Capitol Police Board.
- (c) Prohibition of Waiver Under Certain Cir-
- 23 CUMSTANCES.—The Chief may not exercise the authority
- 24 to waive a claim under subsection (a) if—

- 1 (1) in the Chief's opinion, there exists in con-
- 2 nection with the claim an indication of fraud, mis-
- 3 representation, fault, or lack of good faith on the
- 4 part of the officer, member, or employee involved or
- 5 of any other person having an interest in obtaining
- 6 a waiver of the claim; or
- 7 (2) the Chief receives the application for the
- 8 waiver after the expiration of the 3-year period that
- 9 begins on the date on which the erroneous payment
- of pay or allowances was discovered.
- 11 (d) Credit for Waiver.—In the audit and settle-
- 12 ment of accounts of any accountable officer or official, full
- 13 credit shall be given for any amounts with respect to which
- 14 collection by the United States is waived under subsection
- 15 (a).
- 16 (e) Effect of Waiver.—An erroneous payment,
- 17 the collection of which is waived under subsection (a), is
- 18 deemed a valid payment for all purposes.
- 19 (f) Construction With Other Laws.—This sec-
- 20 tion does not affect any authority under any other law
- 21 to litigate, settle, compromise, or waive any claim of the
- 22 United States.
- 23 (g) Rules and Regulations.—The Chief shall pro-
- 24 mulgate rules and regulations to carry out this section.

1	(h) Effective Date.—This section shall apply with
2	respect to payments of pay and allowances made at any
3	time after the Chief became the disbursing officer for the
4	United States Capitol Police pursuant to section 1018(a)
5	of the Legislative Branch Appropriations Act, 2003 (2
6	U.S.C. 1907(a)).
7	OFFICE OF COMPLIANCE
8	SALARIES AND EXPENSES
9	For salaries and expenses of the Office of Compli-
10	ance, as authorized by section 305 of the Congressional
11	Accountability Act of 1995 (2 U.S.C. 1385), \$3,817,000,
12	of which \$884,000 shall remain available until September
13	30, 2013: Provided, That not more than \$500 may be ex-
14	pended on the certification of the Executive Director of
15	the Office of Compliance in connection with official rep-
16	resentation and reception expenses.
17	CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET OFFICE
18	Salaries and Expenses
19	For salaries and expenses necessary for operation of
20	the Congressional Budget Office, including not more than
21	\$6,000 to be expended on the certification of the Director
22	of the Congressional Budget Office in connection with offi-
23	cial representation and reception expenses \$43,787,000

12	remain available until expended.
13	Capitol Power Plant
14	For all necessary expenses for the maintenance, care
15	and operation of the Capitol Power Plant; lighting, heat-
16	ing, power (including the purchase of electrical energy)
17	and water and sewer services for the Capitol, Senate and
18	House office buildings, Library of Congress buildings, and
19	the grounds about the same, Botanic Garden, Senate ga-
20	rage, and air conditioning refrigeration not supplied from
21	plants in any of such buildings; heating the Government
22	Printing Office and Washington City Post Office, and
23	heating and chilled water for air conditioning for the Su-
24	preme Court Building, the Union Station complex, the

- 5 \$632,780): Provided, That of the amount made available
- 6 under this heading, the Architect may obligate and expend
- 7 such sums as may be necessary for the maintenance, care
