A BILL

To eliminate the reimbursement requirement for certain tornado shelters constructed with Federal assistance, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Community Shelter
- 5 Protection Act of 2011".
- 6 SEC. 2. NO REIMBURSEMENT REQUIRED FOR COVERED
- 7 TORNADO SHELTER FACILITIES.
- 8 (a) In General.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
- 9 sion of law, the Federal Emergency Management Agency

1	(FEMA) shall not require an educational institution Pub-
2	lic Assistance applicant to reimburse FEMA for the mar-
3	ket value of a covered temporary tornado shelter facility
4	when the facility is no longer needed for its temporary
5	purpose.
6	(b) Definitions.—In this section the following defi-
7	nitions apply:
8	(1) COVERED TEMPORARY TORNADO SHELTER
9	FACILITY.—The term "covered temporary shelter fa-
10	cility" means a structure—
11	(A) designed to provide children protection
12	from a tornado; and
13	(B) constructed or acquired with Federal
14	financial assistance.
15	(2) EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION.—The term
16	"educational institution" means any elementary
17	school or any secondary school that is an eligible ap-
18	plicant for FEMA assistance pursuant to section
19	403 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and
20	Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5170b).
