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## A BILL

To amend title 49, United States Code, to modify cost-sharing requirements under certain public transportation grant programs, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Community Transit  
5 Promotion Act of 2011”.

1 **SEC. 2. COST-SHARING REQUIREMENTS UNDER CERTAIN**  
2 **PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION GRANT PRO-**  
3 **GRAMS.**

4 (a) **JOB ACCESS AND REVERSE COMMUTE FORMULA**  
5 **GRANTS.**—Section 5316(h) of title 49, United States  
6 Code, is amended—

7 (1) in paragraph (2) by striking “50 percent”  
8 and inserting “80 percent”; and

9 (2) in paragraph (3) by striking subparagraph  
10 (A) and inserting the following:

11 “(A) may be provided from an undistrib-  
12 uted cash surplus, a replacement or deprecia-  
13 tion cash fund or reserve, fare box revenues, a  
14 service agreement with a transit provider, a  
15 service agreement with a State or local social  
16 service agency or a private social service organi-  
17 zation, or new capital; and”.

18 (b) **NEW FREEDOM PROGRAM.**—Section 5317(g) of  
19 such title is amended—

20 (1) in paragraph (2) by striking “50 percent”  
21 and inserting “80 percent”; and

22 (2) in paragraph (3) by striking subparagraph  
23 (A) and inserting the following:

24 “(A) may be provided from an undistrib-  
25 uted cash surplus, a replacement or deprecia-  
26 tion cash fund or reserve, fare box revenues, a
