## <sup>112TH CONGRESS</sup> **H. R. 3641**

### AN ACT

- To establish Pinnacles National Park in the State of California as a unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Pinnacles National3 Park Act".

#### 4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

5 The Congress makes the following findings:

6 (1) Pinnacles National Monument was estab-7 lished by Presidential Proclamation 796 on January 8 16, 1908, for the purposes of protecting its rock for-9 mations, and expanded by Presidential Proclamation 10 1660 of May 7, 1923; Presidential Proclamation 11 1704 of July 2, 1924; Presidential Proclamation 12 1948 of April 13, 1931; Presidential Proclamation 13 2050 of July 11, 1933; Presidential Proclamation 14 2528 of December 5, 1941; Public Law 94–567; and 15 Presidential Proclamation 7266 of January 11, 16 2000.

(2) While the extraordinary geology of Pinnacles National Monument has attracted and enthralled visitors for well over a century, the expanded Monument now serves a critical role in protecting other important natural and cultural resources and ecological processes. This expanded role
merits recognition through legislation.

24 (3) Pinnacles National Monument provides the
25 best remaining refuge for floral and fauna species

Pacific coast range, including 32 species holding spe cial Federal or State status, not only because of its
 multiple ecological niches but also because of its
 long-term protected status with 14,500 acres of Con gressionally designated wilderness.

6 (4) Pinnacles National Monument encompasses 7 a unique blend of California heritage from pre-8 historic and historic Native Americans to the arrival 9 of the Spanish, followed by 18th and 19th century 10 settlers, including miners, cowboys, vaqueros, ranch-11 ers, farmers, and homesteaders.

12 (5) Pinnacles National Monument is the only 13 National Park System site within the ancestral home 14 range of the California Condor. The reintroduction of the condor to its traditional range in California 15 16 is important to the survival of the species, and as a 17 result, the scientific community with centers at the 18 Los Angeles Zoo and San Diego Zoo in California 19 and Buenos Aires Zoo in Argentina looks to Pin-20 nacles National Monument as a leader in California 21 Condor recovery, and as an international partner for 22 condor recovery in South America.

(6) The preservation, enhancement, economic
and tourism potential and management of the central California coast and Pacific coast range's impor-

tant natural and cultural resources requires coopera tion and partnerships among local property owners,
 Federal, State, and local government entities and
 the private sector.

#### 5 SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF PINNACLES NATIONAL PARK.

6 (a) ESTABLISHMENT AND PURPOSE.—There is here7 by established Pinnacles National Park in the State of
8 California for the purposes of—

9 (1) preserving and interpreting for the benefit 10 of future generations the chaparral, grasslands, blue 11 oak woodlands, and majestic valley oak savanna eco-12 systems of the area, the area's geomorphology, ri-13 parian watersheds, unique flora and fauna, and the 14 ancestral and cultural history of native Americans, 15 settlers and explorers; and

16 (2) interpreting the recovery program for the
17 California Condor and the international significance
18 of the program.

19 (b) BOUNDARIES.—The boundaries of Pinnacles Na-20 tional Park are as generally depicted on the map entitled 21 "Proposed: Pinnacles National Park Designation 22 Change", numbered 114/111,724, and dated December 23 2011. The map shall be on file and available for public 24 inspection in the appropriate offices of the National Park Service. 25

(c) Abolishment of Current Pinnacles Na tional Monument.—

3 (1) IN GENERAL.—In light of the establishment
4 of Pinnacles National Park, Pinnacles National
5 Monument is hereby abolished and the lands and in6 terests therein are incorporated within and made
7 part of Pinnacles National Park. Any funds avail8 able for purposes of the monument shall be available
9 for purposes of the park.

10 (2) REFERENCES.—Any references in law
11 (other than in this Act), regulation, document,
12 record, map or other paper of the United States to
13 Pinnacles National Monument shall be considered a
14 reference to Pinnacles National Park.

(d) ADMINISTRATION.—The Secretary of the Interior
shall administer Pinnacles National Park in accordance
with this Act and laws generally applicable to units of the
National Park System, including the National Park Service Organic Act (16 U.S.C. 1, 2–4).

20sec. 4. redesignation of pinnacles wilderness as21Hain wilderness.

Subsection (i) of the first section of Public Law 94–
567 (90 Stat. 2693; 16 U.S.C. 1132 note) is amended by
striking "Pinnacles Wilderness" and inserting "Hain Wilderness". Any reference in a law, map, regulation, docu-

ment, paper, or other record of the United States to the
 Pinnacles Wilderness shall be deemed to be a reference
 to the Hain Wilderness.
