# A BILL

To authorize the Attorney General to provide a grant to assist Federal, State, tribal, and local law enforcement agencies in the rapid recovery of missing individuals.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2   *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3   **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       *This Act may be cited as the “Child and Elderly Miss-*  
5   *ing Alert Program”.*

6   **SEC. 2. PROGRAM TO ASSIST FEDERAL, STATE, TRIBAL, AND**

7           **LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES IN THE**  
8           **RAPID RECOVERY OF MISSING CHILDREN,**  
9           **THE ELDERLY, AND DISABLED INDIVIDUALS.**

10       *Section 1701 of title I of the Omnibus Crime Control*  
11   *and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796dd) is amend-*  
12   *ed—*

13       *(1) in subsection (b)—*

14           *(A) in paragraph (16), by striking “and”*  
15           *after the semicolon;*

16           *(B) in paragraph (17), by striking the pe-*  
17           *riod and inserting “; and”; and*

18           *(C) by adding at the end the following new*  
19           *paragraph:*

20       *“(18) to permit eligible nonprofit organizations*  
21   *to assist Federal, State, tribal, and local law enforce-*  
22   *ment agencies in the rapid recovery of missing chil-*  
23   *dren, elderly individuals, and disabled individuals*  
24   *through the use of a rapid telephone and cellular alert*  
25   *call system, in accordance with subsection (l).”; and*

1                   (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-  
2                   section:

3                   “(l) CHILD AND ELDERLY MISSING ALERTS.—

4                   “(1) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General is au-  
5                   thorized to award grants to eligible nonprofit organi-  
6                   zations to assist Federal, State, tribal, and local law  
7                   enforcement agencies in the rapid recovery of missing  
8                   children, elderly individuals, and disabled individuals  
9                   through the use of a rapid telephone and cellular alert  
10                  call system.

11                  “(2) SPECIFIED USE OF FUNDS.—The grants  
12                  awarded under this subsection shall be used to—

13                  “(A) provide services to Federal, State, trib-  
14                  al, and local law enforcement agencies, in re-  
15                  sponse to a request from such agencies, to pro-  
16                  mote the rapid recovery of a missing child, an  
17                  elderly individual, or a disabled individual by  
18                  utilizing rapid telephone and cellular alert calls;

19                  “(B) maintain and expand technologies and  
20                  techniques to ensure the highest level of perform-  
21                  ance of such services;

22                  “(C) provide both centralized and on-site  
23                  training and distribute information to Federal,  
24                  State, tribal, and local law enforcement agency  
25                  officials about missing children, elderly individ-

1           *uals, and disabled individuals and use of a*  
2           *rapid telephone and cellular alert call system;*

3           “*D) provide services to Federal, State, tribal,*  
4           *and local Child Abduction Response Teams;*

5           “*E) assist Federal, State, tribal, and local*  
6           *law enforcement agencies to combat human traf-*  
7           *ficking through the use of rapid telephone and*  
8           *cellular alert calls;*

9           “*F) share appropriate information on*  
10          *cases with the National Center for Missing and*  
11          *Exploited Children, the AMBER Alert, Silver*  
12          *Alert, and Blue Alert programs, and appropriate*  
13          *Federal, State, tribal, and local law enforcement*  
14          *agencies; and*

15          “*G) assist appropriate organizations, in-*  
16          *cluding Federal, State, tribal, and local law en-*  
17          *forcement agencies, with education and preven-*  
18          *tion programs related to missing children, elderly*  
19          *individuals, and disabled individuals.*

20          “(3) *ELIGIBILITY.—To be an eligible nonprofit*  
21          *organization for purposes of a grant under this sub-*  
22          *section, a nonprofit organization shall have experi-*  
23          *ence providing rapid telephone and cellular alert calls*  
24          *on behalf of Federal, State, and local law enforcement*  
25          *agencies to find missing children and elderly adults.*

1           “(4) *GRANT PERIOD AND RENEWAL.*—The Attorney  
2         General shall determine an appropriate grant pe-  
3         riod for grants awarded under this subsection. Such  
4         grants may be renewed at the discretion of the Attorney  
5         General.

6           “(5) *EVALUATION.*—The Attorney General shall  
7         require each grantee under this subsection to annually  
8         submit the results of the monitoring and evaluations  
9         required under subsections (a) and (b) of section  
10         1705, and shall publish an annual report regarding  
11         such results and the effectiveness of the activities car-  
12         ried out under each such grant.

13          “(6) *INAPPLICABLE PROVISIONS.*—The following  
14         provisions of this part shall not apply to grants  
15         awarded under this subsection:

16           “(A) Subsection (j) of this section (relating  
17         to grants to Indian tribes).

18           “(B) Section 1703 (relating to renewal of  
19         grants).

20          “(7) *DEFINITIONS.*—In this subsection:

21           “(A) *CHILD.*—The term ‘child’ means an  
22         individual under 21 years of age.

23           “(B) *DISABLED INDIVIDUAL.*—The term  
24         ‘disabled individual’ means—

1                   “(i) an individual with 1 or more dis-  
2                   abilities (as defined in section 3 of the  
3                   Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42  
4                   U.S.C. 12102)); or

5                   “(ii) an individual who has been diag-  
6                   nosed by a physician or other qualified  
7                   medical professional with Alzheimer’s dis-  
8                   ease or a related dementia.

9                   “(C) ELDERLY INDIVIDUAL.—The term ‘el-  
10                  derly individual’ means an individual who is 60  
11                  years of age or older.

12                  “(D) MISSING.—The term ‘missing’, with  
13                  respect to a child, an elderly individual, or a  
14                  disabled individual, means such a child or indi-  
15                  vidual who has been reported to law enforcement  
16                  as missing and whose whereabouts are unknown  
17                  to Federal, State, tribal, and local law enforce-  
18                  ment agencies.

19                  “(E) RAPID TELEPHONE AND CELLULAR  
20                  ALERT CALL SYSTEM.—The term ‘rapid telephone  
21                  and cellular alert call system’ means an auto-  
22                  mated system with the ability to place at least  
23                  1,000 telephone and cellular calls in 60 seconds  
24                  to a specific geographic area determined by law  
25                  enforcement—

1               “(i) based on the last known where-  
2       abouts of a missing individual; or  
3               “(ii) based on other evidence and deter-  
4       mined by such law enforcement agency to be  
5       necessary to the search for the missing indi-  
6       vidual.”.



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
