A BILL

To provide for the development of a plan to increase oil and gas exploration, development, and production under oil and gas leases of Federal lands under the jurisdiction of the Secretary of Agriculture, the Secretary of Energy, the Secretary of the Interior, and the Secretary of Defense in response to a drawdown of petroleum reserves from the Strategic Petroleum Reserve.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Strategic Energy Pro-
5	duction Act of 2012".
6	SEC. 2. PLAN FOR INCREASING DOMESTIC OIL AND GAS EX-
7	PLORATION, DEVELOPMENT, AND PRODUC-
8	TION FROM FEDERAL LANDS IN RESPONSE
9	TO STRATEGIC PETROLEUM RESERVE DRAW-
10	DOWN.
11	Section 161 of the Energy Policy and Conservation
12	Act $(42~\mathrm{U.S.C.}~6241)$ is amended by adding at the end
13	the following new subsection:
14	"(k) Plan.—
15	"(1) Contents.—
16	"(A) In general.—Not later than 180
17	days after the date on which the Secretary exe-
18	cutes, in accordance with the provisions of this
19	section, the first sale after the date of enact-
20	ment of this subsection of petroleum products
21	in the Reserve the Secretary shall develop a
22	plan to increase the percentage of Federal lands
23	(including submerged lands of the Outer Conti-
24	nental Shelf) under the jurisdiction of the Sec-
25	retary of Agriculture, the Secretary of Energy,

1 the Secretary of the Interior, and the Secretary 2 of Defense leased for oil and gas exploration, 3 development, and production. The percentage of 4 the total amount of the Federal lands described in the preceding sentence by which the plan de-6 veloped under this paragraph will increase leas-7 ing for oil and gas exploration, development, 8 and production shall be the same as the per-9 centage of petroleum in the Strategic Petroleum 10 Reserve that was drawn down. 11 "(B) REQUIREMENTS.—The plan devel-12 oped under this paragraph shall—

- "(i) be consistent with a national energy policy to meet the present and future energy needs of the Nation consistent with economic goals; and
- "(ii) promote the interests of consumers through the provision of an adequate and reliable supply of domestic transportation fuels at the lowest reasonable cost.
- "(C) Energy information.—The Secretary shall base the determination of the present and future energy needs of the Nation, for purposes of subparagraph (B)(i), on infor-

- 1 mation from the Energy Information Adminis-2 tration.
 - "(2) LIMITATION.—The plan developed under paragraph (1) shall not provide for oil and gas exploration, development, and production leasing of a total of more than 10 percent of the Federal lands described in paragraph (1)(A).
 - "(3) Consultation.—The Secretary shall develop the plan required by paragraph (1) in consultation with the Secretary of Agriculture, the Secretary of the Interior, and the Secretary of Defense. Additionally, in developing the plan, the Secretary shall consult with the American Association of Petroleum Geologists and other State, environmentalist, and oil and gas industry stakeholders to determine the most geologically promising lands for production of oil and natural gas liquids.
 - "(4) COMPLIANCE WITH REQUIREMENTS.— Each Federal agency described in paragraph (1)(A) shall comply with any requirements established by the Secretary pursuant to the plan.
- 22 "(5) EXCLUSIONS.—The lands referred to in 23 paragraph (1)(A) shall not include lands managed

- 1 under the National Park System or the National
- Wilderness Preservation System.".
