Mr. SCHRADER introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To provide for the addition of certain real property to the reservation of the Siletz Tribe in the State of Oregon.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. TREATMENT OF CERTAIN PROPERTY OF THE**

4 **SILETZ TRIBE OF THE STATE OF OREGON.**

5 Section 7 of the Siletz Tribe Indian Restoration Act
6 (25 U.S.C. 711e) is amended by adding at the end the
7 following:

8 “(f) TREATMENT OF CERTAIN PROPERTY.—

9 “(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may accept
10 title to any additional number of acres of real prop-

1 erty located within the boundaries of the original
2 1855 Siletz Coast Reservation established by Execu-
3 tive Order dated November 9, 1855, comprised of
4 land within the political boundaries of Benton,
5 Douglas, Lane, Lincoln, Tillamook, and Yamhill
6 Counties in the State of Oregon, if that real prop-
7 erty is conveyed or otherwise transferred to the
8 United States by or on behalf of the tribe. Land to
9 which title is accepted by the Secretary under this
10 paragraph shall be held by the Secretary in trust for
11 the tribe.

12 “(2) TREATMENT AS PART OF RESERVATION.—
13 All real property that is taken into trust under para-
14 graph (1) shall—

15 “(A) be considered and evaluated as an on-
16 reservation acquisition under part 151.10 of
17 title 25, Code of Federal Regulations (or suc-
18 cessor regulations); and

19 “(B) become part of the reservation of the
20 tribe.

21 “(3) PROHIBITION ON GAMING.—Any real prop-
22 erty taken into trust under paragraph (1) shall not
23 be eligible, or used, for any gaming activity carried

1 out under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (25
2 U.S.C.A. 2701 et seq.).”

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
