Mr. Ross of Florida introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Budget

A BILL

To require zero-based budgeting for departments and agencies of the Government.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. ZERO-BASED BUDGETING.

4 Section 1105 of title 31, United States Code, is
5 amended by adding at the end the following new sub6 section:

7 "(i)(1) The President shall submit with materials re8 lated to each budget transmitted under subsection (a) on
9 or after January 1, 2013, a budget for each department
10 and agency which contains the following information:

"(A) A description of each activity for which
 the department or agency receives an appropriation
 in the current fiscal year or for which the depart ment of agency requests an appropriation for the
 budget year.

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6 "(B) The legal basis for each activity.

7 "(C) For each activity, three alternative fund8 ing levels for the budget year, and a summary of the
9 priorities that would be accomplished within each
10 level, and the additional increments of value that
11 would be added by the higher funding levels. At least
12 two of these funding levels shall be below the fund13 ing level for the current fiscal year.

14 "(D) For each activity, one or more measures15 of its cost efficiency and effectiveness.

16 "(2) As soon as practicable, the Director of the Office 17 of Management and Budget shall publish guidelines to 18 carry out this subsection. The guidelines shall require that 19 the baseline budget of each department or agency is as-20 sumed to be zero and each proposed expenditure shall be 21 justified as if it were a new expenditure.".

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
