6 All points of order against consideration of the joint reso-

1 lution are waived. The joint resolution shall be considered
2 as read. All points of order against provisions in the joint
3 resolution are waived. The previous question shall be con-
4 sidered as ordered on the joint resolution to final passage
5 without intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate
6 equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking
7 minority member of the Committee on Energy and Com-
8 merce; and (2) one motion to recommit.
