

1 (as the case may be) may provide the recipient or the fam-
2 ily member with a Capitol-flown flag, together with the
3 certificate described in subsection (c), except that not
4 more than one flag may be provided under this resolution
5 with respect to the Medal of Honor recipient involved.

6 (b) NO COST TO FAMILY.—A flag provided under
7 this section shall be provided at no cost to the individual
8 receiving the flag.

9 (c) CERTIFICATE DESCRIBED.—The certificate de-
10 scribed in this subsection is a certificate which is signed
11 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the
12 Representative providing the flag, and which reads as fol-
13 lows: “This flag has been flown over the United States
14 Capitol, in honor of the service and sacrifice of recipients
15 of the Medal of Honor, the highest honor awarded to
16 members of the Armed Forces for valor in combat, with
17 profound gratitude on behalf of the United States House
18 of Representatives.”.

19 (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

20 (1) the term “Capitol-flown flag” means a
21 United States flag flown over the United States
22 Capitol in honor of the Medal of Honor recipient in-
23 volved; and

24 (2) the term “Representative” includes a Dele-
25 gate or Resident Commissioner to the Congress.

1 **SEC. 3. REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 30 days after the
3 date of the date of the adoption of this resolution, the
4 Clerk of the House of Representatives shall issue regula-
5 tions for carrying out this resolution, including regulations
6 to establish procedures (including any appropriate forms,
7 guidelines, and accompanying certificates) for requesting
8 a Capitol-flown flag.

9 (b) APPROVAL BY COMMITTEE ON HOUSE ADMINIS-
10 TRATION.—The regulations issued by the Clerk under sub-
11 section (a) shall take effect upon approval by the Com-
12 mittee on House Administration of the House of Rep-
13 resentatives.
