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**A BILL**

To authorize the Peace Corps Commemorative Foundation to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia and its environs, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. MEMORIAL TO COMMEMORATE AMERICA'S**  
2 **COMMITMENT TO INTERNATIONAL SERVICE**  
3 **AND GLOBAL PROSPERITY.**

4 (a) **AUTHORIZATION TO ESTABLISH COMMEMORA-**  
5 **TIVE WORK.**—The Peace Corps Commemorative Founda-  
6 tion may establish a commemorative work on Federal land  
7 in the District of Columbia and its environs to commemo-  
8 rate the mission of the Peace Corps and the ideals on  
9 which the Peace Corps was founded.

10 (b) **COMPLIANCE WITH STANDARDS FOR COMMEMO-**  
11 **RATIVE WORKS ACT.**—The establishment of the com-  
12 memorative work under this section shall be in accordance  
13 with chapter 89 of title 40, United States Code (commonly  
14 known as the “Commemorative Works Act”).

15 (c) **USE OF FEDERAL FUNDS PROHIBITED.**—

16 (1) **IN GENERAL.**—Federal funds may not be  
17 used to pay any expense of the establishment of the  
18 commemorative work under this section.

19 (2) **RESPONSIBILITY OF PEACE CORPS.**—The  
20 Peace Corps Commemorative Foundation shall be  
21 solely responsible for acceptance of contributions for,  
22 and payment of the expenses of, the establishment  
23 of the commemorative work under this section.

24 (d) **DEPOSIT OF EXCESS FUNDS.**—If, on payment of  
25 all expenses for the establishment of the commemorative  
26 work under this section (including the maintenance and

1 preservation amount required by section 8906(b)(1) of  
2 title 40, United States Code), or on expiration of the au-  
3 thority for the commemorative work under section 8903(e)  
4 of title 40, United States Code, there remains a balance  
5 of funds received for the establishment of the commemora-  
6 tive work, the Peace Corps Commemorative Foundation  
7 shall transmit the amount of the balance to the Secretary  
8 of the Interior for deposit in the account provided for in  
9 section 8906(b)(3) of title 40, United States Code.

10 **SEC. 2. BUDGETARY EFFECTS.**

11       The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of  
12 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010,  
13 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement  
14 titled “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation” for this  
15 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record  
16 by the Chairman of the Senate Budget Committee, pro-  
17 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the  
18 vote on passage.
