#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Protect Our Disabled

5 Heroes Act of 2011".

## 6 SEC. 2. REINSTATEMENT OF PENALTIES FOR CHARGING 7 VETERANS UNAUTHORIZED FEES.

- 8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 5905 of title 38, United

2 "Except as provided in section 5904 or 1984 of this
3 title, whoever—

4 "(1) in connection with a proceeding before the
5 Department, knowingly solicits, contracts for,
6 charges, or receives any fee or compensation in con7 nection for—

8 "(A) the provision of advice on how to file
9 a claim for benefits under the laws adminis10 tered by the Secretary; or

"(B) the preparation, presentation, or
prosecution of such a claim before the date on
which a notice of disagreement is filed in a proceeding on the claim;

15 "(2) attempts to solicit, contract, charge, or re16 ceive as described in paragraph (1);

17 "(3) unlawfully withholds from any claimant or
18 beneficiary any part of a benefit or claim under the
19 laws administered by the Secretary that is allowed
20 and due to the claimant or beneficiary, or attempts
21 to do so;

"(4) commits an offense punishable by this
chapter, or aids, abets, counsels, commands, or procures the commission of such an act; or

25 "(5) causes an act to be done, which if directly26 performed would be punishable by this chapter,

shall be fined as provided in title 18, or imprisoned for
 not more than one year, or both.".

3 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
4 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to acts committed
5 after the date of the enactment of this Act.
