A BILL

To prevent trafficking in counterfeit drugs.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Counterfeit Drug Pen-
- 5 alty Enhancement Act of 2011".
- 6 SEC. 2. COUNTERFEIT DRUG PREVENTION.
- 7 Section 2320(a) of title 18, United States Code, is
- 8 amended—

1	(1) by redesignating paragraph (2) as para-
2	graph (3);
3	(2) by inserting after paragraph (1) the fol-
4	lowing:
5	"(2) Counterfeit drugs.—
6	"(A) In general.—Whoever commits an
7	offense in violation of paragraph (1) with re-
8	spect to a drug (as defined in section 201 of the
9	Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (21
10	U.S.C. 321)) shall—
11	"(i) if an individual, be fined not more
12	than \$4,000,000, imprisoned not more
13	than 20 years, or both; and
14	"(ii) if a person other than an indi-
15	vidual, be fined not more than
16	\$10,000,000.
17	"(B) Multiple offenses.—In the case
18	of an offense by a person under this paragraph
19	that occurs after that person is convicted of an-
20	other offense under this paragraph, the person
21	convicted—
22	"(i) if an individual, shall be fined not
23	more than \$8,000,000, imprisoned not
24	more than 20 years, or both; and

1	"(ii) if other than an individual, shall
2	be fined not more than \$20,000,000."; and
3	(3) in paragraph (3)(B), as redesignated, by
4	striking "paragraph (1)" and inserting "paragraph
5	(1) or (2)".
6	SEC. 3. SENTENCING COMMISSION DIRECTIVE.
7	(a) Directive to Sentencing Commission.—Pur-
8	suant to its authority under section 994(p) of title 28,
9	United States Code, and in accordance with this section,
10	the United States Sentencing Commission shall review and
11	amend, if appropriate, its guidelines and its policy state-
12	ments applicable to persons convicted of an offense under
13	section 2320(a)(2) of title 18, United States Code, in
14	order to reflect the intent of Congress that such penalties
15	be increased in comparison to those currently provided by
16	the guidelines and policy statements.
17	(b) Requirements.—In carrying out this section,
18	the Commission shall—
19	(1) ensure that the sentencing guidelines and
20	policy statements reflect the intent of Congress that
21	the guidelines and policy statements reflect the seri-
22	ous nature of the offenses described in subsection
23	(a) and the need for an effective deterrent and ap-
24	propriate punishment to prevent such offenses;

1	(2) consider the extent to which the guidelines
2	may or may not appropriately account for the poten-
3	tial and actual harm to the public resulting from the
4	offense;

- (3) assure reasonable consistency with other relevant directives and with other sentencing guidelines;
- (4) account for any additional aggravating or mitigating circumstances that might justify exceptions to the generally applicable sentencing ranges;
- (5) make any necessary conforming changes to the sentencing guidelines; and
- (6) assure that the guidelines adequately meet the purposes of sentencing as set forth in section 3553(a)(2) of title 18, United States Code.
