A BILL

To require the Secretary of Homeland Security to prescribe regulations imposing a fee on air carriers that charge passengers for a first checked bag or a first carry-on bag, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fair Airline Industry
- 5 Revenue Act of 2011".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress makes the following findings:

- 1 (1) Security service costs have increased for the 2 Transportation Security Administration since many 3 air carriers began to impose a fee for the first bag 4 checked by a passenger.
 - (2) As a result of the additional fee imposed by air carriers, more passengers are opting to carry baggage on aircraft, resulting in a need for more staff and more time for screening at airport security checkpoints.
- 10 (3) The Transportation Security Administration 11 estimates that, as a result of the increase in carry-12 on baggage being screened at airport security check-13 points, the Administration is spending an additional 14 \$260,000,000 on screening, which is detracting from 15 resources available for other security programs.

- 3 (b) Amount of Fees.—The fee imposed pursuant
- 4 to subsection (a) may not exceed—
- 5 (1) \$2.00 per passenger charged for the first
- 6 bag checked or carried on the aircraft by the pas-
- 7 senger; or
- 8 (2) \$260,000,000 in the aggregate on all air
- 9 carriers in a year.
