## In the House of Representatives, U. S.,

Resolved, That the bill from the Senate (S. 1959) entitled "An Act to require a report on the designation of the Haqqani Network as a foreign terrorist organization and for other purposes.", do pass with the following

## **AMENDMENT:**

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert:

1	SECTION	1. SHORT	TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Haqqani Network Ter-
- 3 rorist Designation Act of 2012".
- 4 SEC. 2. REPORT ON DESIGNATION OF THE HAQQANI NET-
- 5 WORK AS A FOREIGN TERRORIST ORGANIZA-
- 6 *TION*.
- 7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following findings:
- 8 (1) A report of the Congressional Research Serv-
- 9 ice on relations between the United States and Paki-
- 10 stan states that "[t]he terrorist network led by
- 11 Jalaluddin Haqqani and his son Sirajuddin, based in
- 12 the FATA, is commonly identified as the most dan-
- 13 gerous of Afghan insurgent groups battling U.S.-led
- 14 forces in eastern Afghanistan".

- (2) The report further states that, in mid-2011, the Hagganis undertook several high-visibility attacks in Afghanistan. First, a late June assault on the Intercontinental Hotel in Kabul by 8 Haggani gun-men and suicide bombers left 18 people dead. Then, on September 10, a truck bomb attack on a United States military base by Haggani fighters in the Wardak province injured 77 United States troops and killed 5 Afghans. A September 13 attack on the United States Embassy compound in Kabul involved an assault that sparked a 20-hour-long gun battle and left 16 Afghans dead, 5 police officers and at least 6 children among them.
  - (3) The report further states that "U.S. and Afghan officials concluded the Embassy attackers were members of the Haqqani network".
  - (4) In September 22, 2011, testimony before the Committee on Armed Services of the Senate, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Admiral Mullen stated that "[t]he Haqqani network, for one, acts as a veritable arm of Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence agency. With ISI support, Haqqani operatives plan and conducted that [September 13] truck bomb attack, as well as the assault on our embassy. We also have credible evidence they were behind the June 28th at-

- tack on the Intercontinental Hotel in Kabul and a
  host of other smaller but effective operations".
- (5) In October 27, 2011, testimony before the 3 4 Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Rep-5 resentatives, Secretary of State Hillary Clinton stated 6 that "we are taking action to target the Haggani 7 leadership on both sides of the border. We're increas-8 ing international efforts to squeeze them operationally 9 and financially. We are already working with the 10 Pakistanis to target those who are behind a lot of the 11 attacks against Afghans and Americans. And I made 12 it very clear to the Pakistanis that the attack on our 13 embassy was an outrage and the attack on our for-14 ward operating base that injured 77 of our soldiers 15 was a similar outrage.".
  - (6) At the same hearing, Secretary of State Clinton further stated that "I think everyone agrees that the Haqqani Network has safe havens inside Pakistan; that those safe havens give them a place to plan and direct operations that kill Afghans and Americans.".
  - (7) On November 1, 2011, the United States Government added Haji Mali Kahn to a list of specially designated global terrorists under Executive Order 13224. The Department of State described

Khan as "a Haqqani Network commander" who has "overseen hundreds of fighters, and has instructed his subordinates to conduct terrorist acts." The designation continued, "Mali Khan has provided support and logistics to the Haqqani Network, and has been involved in the planning and execution of attacks in Afghanistan against civilians, coalition forces, and Afghan police". According to Jason Blazakis, the chief of the Terrorist Designations Unit of the Department of State, Khan also has links to al-Qaeda.

been placed on the list of specially designated global terrorists under Executive Order 13224 since 2008, and three of them have been so placed in the last year. Sirajuddin Haqqani, the overall leader of the Haqqani Network as well as the leader of the Taliban's Mira shah Regional Military Shura, was designated by the Secretary of State as a terrorist in March 2008, and in March 2009, the Secretary of State put out a bounty of \$5,000,000 for information leading to his capture. The other four individuals so designated are Nasiruddin Haqqani, Khalil al Rahman Haqqani, Badruddin Haqqani, and Mullah Sangeen Zadran.

15	(A) a detailed report on whether the			
16	Haqqani Network meets the criteria for designa-			
17	tion as a foreign terrorist organization as set			
18	forth in section 219 of the Immigration and Na-			
19	tionality Act (8 U.S.C. 1189); and			
20	(B) if the Secretary determines that the			
21	Haqqani Network does not meet the criteria set			
22	forth under such section 219, a detailed justifica-			
23	tion as to which criteria have not been met.			

1	(2) FORM.—The report required by paragraph				
2	(1) shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may				
3	include a classified annex.				
4	(3) Appropriate committees of congress				
5	Defined.—In this subsection, the term "appropriate				
6	committees of Congress" means—				
7	(A) the Committee on Armed Services, the				
8	Committee on Foreign Relations, the Committee				
9	on the Judiciary, and the Select Committee on				
10	Intelligence of the Senate; and				
11	(B) the Committee on Armed Services, the				
12	Committee on Foreign Affairs, the Committee on				
13	the Judiciary, and the Permanent Select Com-				
14	mittee on Intelligence of the House of Represent-				
15	atives.				
16	(d) Construction.—Nothing in this Act may be con-				
17	strued to infringe upon the sovereignty of Pakistan to com-				
18	bat militant or terrorist groups operating inside the bound-				
19	aries of Pakistan.
