A BILL

To extend the authorization of the Drug-Free Communities Support Program through fiscal year 2017.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF THE DRUG-FREE COMMUNITIES**
 2 **SUPPORT PROGRAM THROUGH FISCAL YEAR**
 3 **2017.**

4 Section 1024(a) of the National Narcotics Leadership
 5 Act of 1988 (21 U.S.C. 1524(a)) is amended by striking
 6 paragraph (9) and all that follows and inserting the fol-
 7 lowing:

- 8 “(9) \$90,000,000 for fiscal year 2006;
 9 “(10) \$99,000,000 for fiscal year 2007;
 10 “(11) \$109,000,000 for fiscal year 2008;
 11 “(12) \$114,000,000 for fiscal year 2009;
 12 “(13) \$119,000,000 for fiscal year 2010;
 13 “(14) \$124,000,000 for fiscal year 2011;
 14 “(15) \$129,000,000 for fiscal year 2012;
 15 “(16) \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 2013;
 16 “(17) \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 2014;
 17 “(18) \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 2015;
 18 “(19) \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 2016; and
 19 “(20) \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 2017.”.

20 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF THE DRUG-FREE COMMUNITIES**
 21 **SUPPORT PROGRAM THROUGH FISCAL YEAR**
 22 **2017.**

23 *Section 1024(a) of the National Narcotics Leadership*
 24 *Act of 1988 (21 U.S.C. 1524(a)) is amended by striking*
 25 *paragraph (9) and all that follows and inserting the fol-*
 26 *lowing:*

1 “(9) \$90,000,000 for fiscal year 2006;
 2 “(10) \$99,000,000 for fiscal year 2007;
 3 “(11) \$109,000,000 for fiscal year 2008;
 4 “(12) \$114,000,000 for fiscal year 2009;
 5 “(13) \$119,000,000 for fiscal year 2010;
 6 “(14) \$124,000,000 for fiscal year 2011;
 7 “(15) \$129,000,000 for fiscal year 2012;
 8 “(16) \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 2013;
 9 “(17) \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 2014;
 10 “(18) \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 2015;
 11 “(19) \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 2016; and
 12 “(20) \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 2017.”.

13 **SEC. 2. OVERSIGHT OF OTHER AGENCY ADMINISTERING**
 14 **DRUG-FREE COMMUNITIES SUPPORT PRO-**
 15 **GRAM.**

16 *Section 1031 of the National Narcotics Leadership Act*
 17 *of 1988 (21 U.S.C. 1531) is amended—*

18 *(1) in subsection (b)—*

19 *(A) in paragraph (2), by striking “and” at*
 20 *the end;*

21 *(B) in paragraph (3), by striking the period*
 22 *at the end and inserting “; and”; and*

23 *(C) by adding at the end the following:*

24 *“(4) ensure that—*

1 “(A) each recipient of an initial grant or a
2 renewal grant meets the grant eligibility criteria
3 under section 1032(a) for each fiscal year; and

4 “(B) the meeting of the grant eligibility cri-
5 teria under section 1032(a) for each fiscal year
6 by each recipient of an initial grant or a re-
7 newal grant is fully documented.”; and

8 (2) in subsection (d)—

9 (A) by striking “The Director” and insert-
10 ing the following: “(1) IN GENERAL.—The Direc-
11 tor”; and

12 (B) by adding at the end the following:

13 “(2) OVERSIGHT OF OTHER AGENCY ADMIN-
14 ISTERING PROGRAM.—If the Director enters into an
15 agreement under paragraph (1) to delegate authority
16 to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services
17 Administration, the Director shall—

18 “(A) develop and document an approach to
19 monitoring and overseeing the administration of
20 the Program by the Substance Abuse and Mental
21 Health Services Administration; and

22 “(B) fully define in the agreement prepared
23 for each fiscal year between the Director and the
24 Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Ad-
25 ministration the respective roles and responsibil-

1 ities, with respect to administering the Program,
2 of—

3 “(i) the Office of National Drug Con-
4 trol Policy, including the role and respon-
5 sibilities of the Administrator; and

6 “(ii) the Substance Abuse and Mental
7 Health Services Administration.”.

8 **SEC. 3. NATIONAL COMMUNITY ANTI-DRUG COALITION IN-**
9 **STITUTE.**

10 Subchapter I of chapter 2 of the National Narcotics
11 Leadership Act of 1988 (21 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.) is amended
12 by adding at the end the following:

13 **“SEC. 1036. NATIONAL COMMUNITY ANTI-DRUG COALITION**
14 **INSTITUTE.**

15 “(a) *IN GENERAL.*—The Director may, using amounts
16 authorized to be appropriated by subsection (d), make a
17 grant to an eligible organization to provide for the estab-
18 lishment of a National Community Anti-Drug Coalition
19 Institute.

20 “(b) *ELIGIBLE ORGANIZATIONS.*—An organization eli-
21 gible for the grant under subsection (a) is any national non-
22 profit organization that represents, provides technical as-
23 sistance and training to, and has special expertise and
24 broad, national-level experience in community anti-drug
25 coalitions under section 1032.

1 “(c) *USE OF GRANT AMOUNT.*—*The organization re-*
2 *ceiving the grant under subsection (a) shall establish a Na-*
3 *tional Community Anti-Drug Coalition Institute to—*

4 “(1) *provide education, training, and technical*
5 *assistance for coalition leaders and community teams,*
6 *with emphasis on the development of coalitions serv-*
7 *ing economically disadvantaged areas;*

8 “(2) *develop and disseminate evaluation tools,*
9 *mechanisms, and measures to better assess and docu-*
10 *ment coalition performance measures and outcomes;*
11 *and*

12 “(3) *bridge the gap between research and prac-*
13 *tice by translating knowledge from research into prac-*
14 *tical information.*

15 “(d) *AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.*—*There is*
16 *authorized to be appropriated for purposes of activities*
17 *under this section, including the grant under subsection (a),*
18 *\$2,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2013 through 2017.”.*

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
