To amend title 11, United States Code, to make bankruptcy organization more efficient for small business debtors, and for other purposes.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Small Business Reor-
- 5 ganization Efficiency and Clarity Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FLEXIBILITY IN CONFIRMATION.
- 7 Section 1129(e) of title 11, United States Code, is
- 8 amended by striking "45 days" and inserting "90 days".

1 SEC. 3. CLARITY IN PERIODIC REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.

- 2 Section 308(b) of title 11, United States Code, is
- 3 amended—
- 4 (1) in paragraph (4), by adding "and" at the
- 5 end;
- 6 (2) in paragraph (5), by striking "; and" at the
- 7 end and inserting a period; and
- 8 (3) by striking paragraph (6).

9 SEC. 4. RETAINING PROFESSIONAL SERVICES.

- 21 SEC. 5. ENFORCEMENT OF SMALL BUSINESS SELECTION.
- Section 1112(b)(4) of title 11, United States Code,
- 23 is amended—
- 24 (1) by redesignating subparagraphs (O) and
- 25 (P) as subparagraphs (P) and (Q), respectively; and

1	(2) by inserting after subparagraph (N) the fol-
2	lowing:
3	"(O) failure of a small business debtor to
4	designate itself as a small business debtor;".
5	SEC. 6. REPORT.
6	Not later than 12 months after the date of enactment
7	of this Act, the Comptroller General of the United States,
8	in consultation with the Administrative Office of United
9	States Courts and the Executive Office of United States
10	Trustees, shall submit a report to Congress detailing—
11	(1) the number and percentage of all cases filed
12	under chapter 11 of title 11, United States Code, in
13	which the debtor is a small business debtor, as that
14	term is defined in section 101(51D) of title 11,
15	United States Code;
16	(2) the number of cases and rates of confirma-
17	tions for small business debtors in cases filed under
18	chapter 11 of title 11, United States Code, as com-
19	pared with—
20	(A) all debtors in cases filed under that
21	chapter 11;
22	(B) all debtors in cases filed under that
23	chapter 11 that are not small business debtors;
24	(C) debtors in cases filed under that chap-
25	ter 11 that—

1	(i) are not small business debtors; and
2	(ii) have less than \$5,000,000 in debt;
3	(D) debtors in cases filed under that chap-
4	ter 11 that—
5	(i) are not small business debtors; and
6	(ii) have less than \$10,000,000 in
7	debt;
8	(E) debtors in cases filed under chapter 12
9	of title 11, United States Code; and
10	(F) debtors in cases filed under that chap-
11	ter 13 that are business cases;
12	(3) the number of cases filed under chapter 11
13	of title 11, United States Code, in which the debtor
14	has less than \$2,190,000 in debt outstanding, but
15	does not designate itself a small business debtor;
16	(4) recommendations for improving the con-
17	firmation rate for small business debtors; and
18	(5) an analysis on whether the definition of the
19	term "small business debtor" should be amended to
20	include businesses with—
21	(A) less than \$5,000,000 in debt; and
22	(B) less than \$10,000,000 in debt.
