To extend the Terrorism Risk Insurance Program of the Department of the Treasury for 10 years.

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Terrorism Risk Insur-
5 ance Program Reauthorization Act of 2013”.

1 **SEC. 2. 10-YEAR EXTENSION OF TERRORISM RISK INSUR-**
2 **ANCE PROGRAM.**

9 inserting “2024”.

10 (c) **TIMING OF MANDATORY RECOUPMENT.**—Section
11 103(e)(7)(E)(i)(III) of the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act
12 of 2002 (15 U.S.C. 6701 note) is amended by striking
13 “2017” and inserting “2027”.

14 (d) **ONGOING REPORTS REGARDING MARKET CONDI-**
15 **TIONS FOR TERRORISM RISK INSURANCE.**—Section
16 108(e)(2) of the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act of 2002
17 (15 U.S.C. 6701 note) is amended by striking “and 2013”
18 and inserting “, 2013, 2017, 2020, and 2023”.
