Mr. YOUNG of Alaska introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To allow for the harvest of gull eggs by the Huna Tlingit
people within Glacier Bay National Park in the State
of Alaska.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Huna Tlingit Tradi-
5 tional Gull Egg Use Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. LIMITED AUTHORIZATION FOR COLLECTION OF**
7 **GULL EGGS.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior (re-
9 ferred to in this Act as the “Secretary”) may allow the
10 collection by members of the Hoonah Indian Association

1 of the eggs of glaucous-winged gulls (*Laurus glaucescens*)
2 within Glacier Bay National Park (referred to in this Act
3 as the “Park”) not more frequently than twice each cal-
4 endar year at up to 5 locations within the Park, subject
5 to any terms and conditions that the Secretary determines
6 to be necessary.

7 (b) APPLICABLE LAW.—For the purposes of sections
8 and 816 of the Alaska National Interest Lands Conserva-
9 tion Act (16 U.S.C. 410hh–2, 3126), the collection of eggs
10 of glaucous-winged gulls within the Park in accordance
11 with subsection (a) shall be considered to be a use specifi-
12 cally permitted by that Act.

13 (c) HARVEST PLAN.—The Secretary shall establish
14 schedules, locations, and any additional terms and condi-
15 tions that the Secretary determines to be necessary for
16 the harvesting of eggs of glaucous-winged gulls in the
17 Park, based on an annual harvest plan to be prepared by
18 the Secretary and the Hoonah Indian Association.
