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## A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide for penalties for aggravated identity theft facilitated by employment at an agency implementing the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “No Identity Theft in  
5       Health Care Act of 2013”.

6       **SEC. 2. CERTAIN HEALTHCARE-RELATED OFFENSES.**

7       Section 1028A of title 18, United States Code, is  
8       amended by inserting after paragraph (2):

1           “(3) CERTAIN HEALTHCARE-RELATED OF-  
2 FENSES.—Whoever, during and in relation to any  
3 felony violation enumerated in subsection (c), know-  
4 ingly transfers, possesses, or uses, without lawful au-  
5 thority, a means of identification of another person,  
6 if that transfer, possession, or use was facilitated by  
7 being an officer or employee of the United States or  
8 of any department or agency thereof charged with  
9 the implementation of the Patient Protection and  
10 Affordable Care Act, shall, in addition to the punish-  
11 ment provided for such felony, be sentenced to a  
12 term of imprisonment of 5 years.”.

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
