## A BILL

To amend section 1111(h)(1)(C)(i) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 to require that annual State report cards reflect the same race groups as the decennial census of population.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “All Students Count  
5 Act of 2014”.

1 **SEC. 2. DISAGGREGATION OF INFORMATION ON STUDENT**  
2 **ACHIEVEMENT IN ANNUAL STATE REPORT**  
3 **CARDS.**

4 Section 1111(h)(1)(C)(i) of the Elementary and Sec-  
5 ondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C.  
6 6311(h)(1)(C)(i)) is amended to read as follows:

7 “(i) information, in the aggregate and  
8 disaggregated by the same major race  
9 groups as the decennial census of the pop-  
10 ulation, ethnicity, gender, disability status,  
11 migrant status, English proficiency, and  
12 status as economically disadvantaged, and  
13 cross-tabulated across all of such sub-  
14 groups by gender and by disability, on stu-  
15 dent achievement at each proficiency level  
16 on the State academic assessments de-  
17 scribed in subsection (b)(3), except that  
18 such disaggregation and cross-tabulation  
19 shall not be required in a case in which the  
20 number of students in a subgroup is insuf-  
21 ficient to yield statistically reliable infor-  
22 mation or the results would reveal person-  
23 ally identifiable information about an indi-  
24 vidual student;”.
