AN ACT

To establish the Commission to Study the Potential Creation of a National Women's History Museum, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Commission to Study
- 3 the Potential Creation of a National Women's History
- 4 Museum Act''.
- 5 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
- 6 In this Act:
- 7 (1) COMMISSION.—The term "Commission"
- 8 means the Commission to Study the Potential Cre-
- 9 ation of a National Women's History Museum estab-
- lished by section 3(a).
- 11 (2) Museum.—The term "Museum" means the
- 12 National Women's History Museum.
- 13 SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION.
- 14 (a) In General.—There is established the Commis-
- 15 sion to Study the Potential Creation of a National Wom-
- 16 en's History Museum.
- 17 (b) Membership.—The Commission shall be com-
- 18 posed of 8 members, of whom—
- 19 (1) 2 members shall be appointed by the major-
- ity leader of the Senate;
- 21 (2) 2 members shall be appointed by the Speak-
- er of the House of Representatives;
- 23 (3) 2 members shall be appointed by the minor-
- 24 ity leader of the Senate; and
- 25 (4) 2 members shall be appointed by the minor-
- ity leader of the House of Representatives.

1	(c) QUALIFICATIONS.—Members of the Commission
2	shall be appointed to the Commission from among individ-
3	uals, or representatives of institutions or entities, who pos-
4	sess—
5	(1)(A) a demonstrated commitment to the re-
6	search, study, or promotion of women's history, art,
7	political or economic status, or culture; and
8	(B)(i) expertise in museum administration;
9	(ii) expertise in fundraising for nonprofit or cul-
10	tural institutions;
11	(iii) experience in the study and teaching of
12	women's history;
13	(iv) experience in studying the issue of the rep-
14	resentation of women in art, life, history, and cul-
15	ture at the Smithsonian Institution; or
16	(v) extensive experience in public or elected
17	service;
18	(2) experience in the administration of, or the
19	planning for, the establishment of, museums; or
20	(3) experience in the planning, design, or con-
21	struction of museum facilities.
22	(d) Prohibition.—No employee of the Federal Gov-
23	ernment may serve as a member of the Commission.
24	(e) DEADLINE FOR INITIAL APPOINTMENT.—The
25	initial members of the Commission shall be appointed not

1	later than the date that is 90 days after the date of enact-				
2	ment of this Act.				
3	(f) Vacancies.—A vacancy in the Commission—				
4	(1) shall not affect the powers of the Commis-				
5	sion; and				
6	(2) shall be filled in the same manner as the				
7	original appointment was made.				
8	(g) Chairperson.—The Commission shall, by ma-				
9	jority vote of all of the members, select 1 member of the				
10	Commission to serve as the Chairperson of the Commis-				
11	sion.				
12	SEC. 4. DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION.				
13	(a) Reports.—				
14	(1) Plan of action.—The Commission shall				
15	submit to the President and Congress a report con-				
16	taining the recommendations of the Commission				
17	with respect to a plan of action for the establishment				
18	and maintenance of a National Women's History				
19	Museum in Washington, DC.				
20	(2) Report on issues.—The Commission shall				
21	submit to the President and Congress a report that				
22	addresses the following issues:				
23	(A) The availability and cost of collections				

1	(B) The impact of the Museum on regional				
2	women history-related museums.				
3	(C) Potential locations for the Museum in				
4	Washington, DC, and its environs.				
5	(D) Whether the Museum should be part				
6	of the Smithsonian Institution.				
7	(E) The governance and organizational				
8	structure from which the Museum should oper-				
9	ate.				
10	(F) Best practices for engaging women in				
11	the development and design of the Museum.				
12	(G) The cost of constructing, operating,				
13	and maintaining the Museum.				
14	(3) DEADLINE.—The reports required under				
15	paragraphs (1) and (2) shall be submitted not later				
16	than the date that is 18 months after the date of				
17	the first meeting of the Commission.				
18	(b) Fundraising Plan.—				
19	(1) In general.—The Commission shall de-				
20	velop a fundraising plan to support the establish-				
21	ment, operation, and maintenance of the Museum				
22	through contributions from the public.				
23	(2) Considerations.—In developing the fund-				
24	raising plan under paragraph (1), the Commission				
25	shall consider—				

- (A) the role of the National Women's History Museum (a nonprofit, educational organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 that was incorporated in 1996 in Washington, DC, and dedicated for the purpose of establishing a women's
 history museum) in raising funds for the construction of the Museum; and
 - (B) issues relating to funding the operations and maintenance of the Museum in perpetuity without reliance on appropriations of Federal funds.
 - (3) Independent review.—The Commission shall obtain an independent review of the viability of the plan developed under paragraph (1) and such review shall include an analysis as to whether the plan is likely to achieve the level of resources necessary to fund the construction of the Museum and the operations and maintenance of the Museum in perpetuity without reliance on appropriations of Federal funds.
 - (4) Submission.—The Commission shall submit the plan developed under paragraph (1) and the review conducted under paragraph (3) to the Committees on Transportation and Infrastructure,

- 1 House Administration, Natural Resources, and Ap-
- 2 propriations of the House of Representatives and the
- 3 Committees on Rules and Administration, Energy
- 4 and Natural Resources, and Appropriations of the
- 5 Senate.
- 6 (c) Legislation To Carry Out Plan of Ac-
- 7 TION.—Based on the recommendations contained in the
- 8 report submitted under paragraphs (1) and (2) of sub-
- 9 section (a), the Commission shall submit for consideration
- 10 to the Committees on Transportation and Infrastructure,
- 11 House Administration, Natural Resources, and Appropria-
- 12 tions of the House of Representatives and the Committees
- 13 on Rules and Administration, Energy and Natural Re-
- 14 sources, and Appropriations of the Senate recommenda-
- 15 tions for a legislative plan of action to establish and con-
- 16 struct the Museum.
- 17 (d) National Conference.—Not later than 18
- 18 months after the date on which the initial members of the
- 19 Commission are appointed under section 3, the Commis-
- 20 sion may, in carrying out the duties of the Commission
- 21 under this section, convene a national conference relating
- 22 to the Museum, to be comprised of individuals committed
- 23 to the advancement of the life, art, history, and culture
- 24 of women.

1 SEC. 5. DIRECTOR AND STAFF OF COMMISSION.

2	(a) DIRECTOR AND STAFF.—					
3	(1) In general.—The Commission may en					
4	ploy and compensate an executive director and an					
5	other additional personnel that are necessary to en					
6	able the Commission to perform the duties of th					
7	Commission.					
8	(2) Rates of pay for person					
9	employed under paragraph (1) shall be consisten					
10	with the rates of pay allowed for employees of a tem					
11	porary organization under section 3161 of title 5					
12	United States Code.					
13	(b) Not Federal Employment.—Any individua					
14	employed under this Act shall not be considered a Federal					
15	employee for the purpose of any law governing Federal					
16	employment.					
17	(c) TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.—					
18	(1) In general.—Subject to paragraph (2), or					
19	request of the Commission, the head of a Federal					
20	agency may provide technical assistance to the Com					
21	mission.					
22	(2) Prohibition.—No Federal employees may					
23	be detailed to the Commission.					
24	SEC. 6. ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS.					

(a) Compensation.—

25

1	(1) In general.—A member of the Commis-					
2	sion—					
3	(A) shall not be considered to be a Federal					
4	employee for any purpose by reason of servi					
5	on the Commission; and					
6	(B) shall serve without pay.					
7	7 (2) Travel expenses.—A member of the					
8	Commission shall be allowed a per diem allowance					
9	for travel expenses, at rates consistent with those					
10	authorized under subchapter I of chapter 57 of titl					
11	5, United States Code.					
12	(b) Gifts, Bequests, Devises.—The Commission					
13	may solicit, accept, use, and dispose of gifts, bequests, or					
14	devises of money, services, or real or personal property for					
15	the purpose of aiding or facilitating the work of the Com-					
16	mission.					
17	(c) Federal Advisory Committee Act.—The					
18	Commission shall not be subject to the Federal Advisory					
19	Committee Act (5 U.S.C. App.).					
20	SEC. 7. TERMINATION.					
21	The Commission shall terminate on the date that is					
22	30 days after the date on which the final versions of the					
23	reports required under section 4(a) are submitted.					

1 SEC. 8. FUNDING.

- 2 (a) In General.—The Commission shall be solely
- 3 responsible for acceptance of contributions for, and pay-
- 4 ment of the expenses of, the Commission.
- 5 (b) Prohibition.—No Federal funds may be obli-
- 6 gated to carry out this Act.
