## A BILL

To clarify the effective date of certain provisions of the Border Patrol Agent Pay Reform Act of 2014, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CLARIFICATION OF EFFECTIVE DATE OF CER-**  
4 **TAIN PROVISIONS OF THE BORDER PATROL**  
5 **AGENT PAY REFORM ACT OF 2014.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 2 of the Border Patrol  
7 Agent Pay Reform Act of 2014 (Public Law 113–277) is  
8 amended by adding at the end the following:

1       “(i) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Subsections (b), (c), (d),  
2 and (g), and the amendments made by such subsections,  
3 shall take effect on the first day of the first pay period  
4 beginning on or after January 1, 2016, except that—

5               “(1) any provision in section 5550(b) of title 5,  
6 United States Code, as added by subsection (b), re-  
7 lating to administering elections and making ad-  
8 vance assignments to a regular tour of duty shall be  
9 applicable before such effective date to the extent de-  
10 termined necessary by the Director of the Office of  
11 Personnel Management; and

12               “(2) the Director may issue regulations as nec-  
13 essary prior to such effective date.”.

14       (b) APPLICATION.—The amendment made by sub-  
15 section (a) shall be deemed to have been enacted on the  
16 date of enactment of the Border Patrol Agent Pay Reform  
17 Act of 2014 (Public Law 113–277).
