A BILL

To provide for the eligibility for burial in Arlington National Cemetery of certain members of reserve components of the Armed Forces.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “FLORICH Act” or
5 “Founding Legacies of Reserve Integral Combat-training
6 Heroes Act of 2015”.

1 **SEC. 2. ELIGIBILITY FOR BURIAL IN ARLINGTON NATIONAL**
2 **CEMETERY OF CERTAIN MEMBERS OF RE-**
3 **SERVE COMPONENTS.**

4 (a) **ELIGIBILITY FOR BURIAL.**—A member of a re-
5 serve component of the Armed Forces described in sub-
6 section (b) is eligible for burial in Arlington National Cem-
7 etery, Arlington, Virginia.

8 (b) **ELIGIBLE MEMBER OF A RESERVE COMPO-**
9 **NENT.**—A member of a reserve component of the Armed
10 Forces described in this subsection is a member of a re-
11 serve component who dies while serving on inactive-duty
12 training during a mission during which a member of the
13 Armed Forces serving on active duty also dies.

14 (c) **SAVINGS PROVISION.**—This section may not be
15 construed to make ineligible for burial in Arlington Na-
16 tional Cemetery a person who is eligible to be buried in
17 that cemetery under another provision of law.

18 (d) **REGULATIONS.**—This section shall be carried out
19 under regulations prescribed by the Secretary of the
20 Army.

21 (e) **DEFINITIONS.**—For purposes of this section, the
22 term “inactive-duty training” has the meaning given such
23 term under section 101(d)(7) of title 10, United States
24 Code.
