A BILL

To provide the Department of Justice with additional tools to target extraterritorial drug trafficking activity, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Transnational Drug
5 Trafficking Act of 2015”.

6 **SEC. 2. POSSESSION, MANUFACTURE OR DISTRIBUTION**
7 **FOR PURPOSES OF UNLAWFUL IMPORTA-**
8 **TIONS.**

9 Section 1009 of the Controlled Substances Import
10 and Export Act (21 U.S.C. 959) is amended—

11 (1) by redesignating subsections (b) and (c) as
12 subsections (c) and (d), respectively; and

13 (2) in subsection (a), by striking “It shall” and
14 all that follows and inserting the following: “It shall
15 be unlawful for any person to manufacture or dis-
16 tribute a controlled substance in schedule I or II or
17 flunitrazepam or a listed chemical intending, know-
18 ing, or having reasonable cause to believe that such
19 substance or chemical will be unlawfully imported
20 into the United States or into waters within a dis-
21 tance of 12 miles of the coast of the United States.

22 “(b) It shall be unlawful for any person to manufac-
23 ture or distribute a listed chemical—

1 “(1) intending or knowing that the listed chem-
2 ical will be used to manufacture a controlled sub-
3 stance; and

4 “(2) intending, knowing, or having reasonable
5 cause to believe that the controlled substance will be
6 unlawfully imported into the United States.”.

7 **SEC. 3. TRAFFICKING IN COUNTERFEIT GOODS OR SERV-**
8 **ICES.**

9 Chapter 113 of title 18, United States Code, is
10 amended—

11 (1) in section 2318(b)(2), by striking “section
12 2320(e)” and inserting “section 2320(f)”; and

13 (2) in section 2320—

14 (A) in subsection (a), by striking para-
15 graph (4) and inserting the following:

16 “(4) traffics in a drug and knowingly uses a
17 counterfeit mark on or in connection with such
18 drug,”;

19 (B) in subsection (b)(3), in the matter pre-
20 ceding subparagraph (A), by striking “counter-
21 feit drug” and inserting “drug that uses a
22 counterfeit mark on or in connection with the
23 drug”; and

24 (C) in subsection (f), by striking para-
25 graph (6) and inserting the following:

1 “(6) the term ‘drug’ means a drug, as defined
2 in section 201 of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cos-
3 metic Act (21 U.S.C. 321).”.

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
