A BILL

To require the Administrator of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to create an electronic database of research and information on the causes of, and corrective actions being taken with regard to, algal blooms in the Great Lakes, their tributaries, and other surface fresh waters, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Great Lakes and Fresh
3 Water Algal Bloom Information Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. GREAT LAKES ALGAL BLOOMS INFORMATION DATA-**
5 **BASE.**

6 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The Administrator of the Na-
7 tional Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration shall cre-
8 ate an electronic database of research and information on
9 the causes and corrective actions being taken with regard
10 to algal blooms in the Great Lakes, their tributaries, and
11 other surface fresh waters.

12 (b) **CONTENTS.**—The Administrator shall include in
13 the database relevant chemical, physical, and biological
14 data that have been collected by an accredited university,
15 association or organization, research group, Federal agen-
16 cy, State, or local government in the United States or
17 Canada.

18 (c) **CONFIDENTIALITY.**—In creating and making in-
19 formation available through the database, the Adminis-
20 trator shall protect confidentiality of information in ac-
21 cordance with all applicable United States laws and regu-
22 lations.

23 (d) **ANNUAL REPORT AND AVAILABILITY OF INFOR-**
24 **MATION.**—The Administrator shall—

25 (1) report to the Congress each year com-
26 prehensive findings on information that was included

1 in the database in the year covered by the report, in-
2 cluding information regarding corrective actions
3 being taken; and

4 (2) make information in the database electroni-
5 cally available to the public.

6 (e) NO NEW AUTHORITY.—This section shall not be
7 construed to grant any authority to the Administrator, in-
8 cluding any authority to require submission of data.

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
